Banks shareholder dividends hit KD 1.5 bln in 2023: report

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 26, (KUNA): The annual Financial Report released by the Central Bank of Kuwait on Thursday disclosed that the banks shareholders dividends grew by 25 percent on annual basis reaching KD 1.5 billion (USD 5.9 billion) in the end of the

The continuous profit earning in the sector was affected with high interests improvement of the assets quality, while the alloca-

tions declined by 15 percent, as compared to the year 2022. The banking sector assets grew by 3.1 percent in the end of

2023, reaching KD 110.4 billion (USD 364 billion). The sector profitability was affected with hike of the noticeable net interest margin amounting to 2.7 percent, while interest free profits rose accounting 32 percent of the whole sector, buoyed by

the increase in investments earnings, by 126 percent. The earnings; improvement over the past year reflected on the profitability indexes and financial efficiency. The average asset proceeds rose by 1.5 percent and that of the equity by 11.1 percent, also in contrast to 2022.

The financial sector maintained its bullish financial solvency, where capital adequacy climbed by 19.9 percent, due to the banks profits and rose of capital of some.

The loans portfolio grew by 2.6 percent reaching KD 69.2 billion (USD 228.3 billion), buoyed by growth of the funding granted to mega companies. Meanwhile, the local currency maintained the lion's share in the portfolio 64.2 percent.

Kuwait, ICI two decades on aim to reinforce ties

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 26, (KUNA): Over the past two decades, since Kuwait joined the Istanbul Cooperation Initiative (ICI) launched by the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), the Gulf state and the organization have been keen to strengthen cooperation in many fields with the aim of solidifying the foundations of security and stability in the region.

Since Kuwait joined the ICI in December 2004 as the first Gulf country, many steps have been taken to strengthen ties, the most important of which was the opening of the headquarters of the NATO Regional Center and the Istanbul Cooperation Initiative in Kuwait on January 23, 2017.

This made the center the first country outside the Euro-Atlantic region to host a regional center for

This center is the first of its kind in the Arabian Gulf region, and a training headquarters through which representatives of NATO members carry out specialized training and advisory tasks in all technical fields for government agencies in Kuwait and the GCC countries who are members of the Istanbul Cooperation Initiative.

Since joining the initiative, Kuwait has contributed to various activities organized by NATO until it became a key partner in the initiative, hosting the (NATO and the Gulf States Confronting Common Challenges through the Istanbul Cooperation Initiative) conference in December 2006 and joined the Partners Program for Individual Cooperation, which was held and adopted in 2014.

Joint statement by US, allies calls for ceasefire in Mideast

WASHINGTON, Sept 26: The United States, Arab and Western countries called on Wednesday for an immediate 21 day ceasefire across the Lebanon-Israel border to avoid a regional war.

This came in a joint statement by the US, Australia, Canada, European Union, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Saudi Arabia, United Arab Émirates, the United Kingdom, and Qatar.

The situation between Lebanon and Israel since October 8th, 2023 is intolerable and presents an unacceptable risk of a broader regional escalation. This is in nobody's interest, neither of the people of Israel nor of the people of Lebanon", the statement issued by the White House said.

"It is time to conclude a diplomatic settlement that enables civilians on both sides of the border to return to their homes in safety. Diplomacy however cannot succeed amid an escalation of this conflict", it added.

"We call for an immediate 21 day ceasefire across the Lebanon-Israel border to provide space for diplomacy towards the conclusion of a diplomatic settlement consistent with UNSCR 1701, and the implementation

Fast-track completion of port, says minister

BEIJING, Sept 26, (KUNA): Kuwaiti Minister of Public Works Dr. Noura Al-Mashaan, and her high-level delegation held talks in Beijing Thursday with China's Minister of Transport Li Xiaopeng, focusing on boosting bilateral cooperation, especially in accelerating the completion of the Mubarak Al-Kabeer Port project.



 $^{4}\,S$ tand up for the teacher and honor his position ... for a teacher is almost a prophet', with this magnificent verse, Ahmad Shawqi, the Prince of Poets, started his famous poem, in which he praises the teacher, and praises the value of education in our lives, as individuals and societies.

This poem, was translated into English, drafted, and presented as a gift to the administration of Strasbourg University, by my daughter, Sheikha/Sarah Sabah Fahad AlNasser AlSabah, may God protect her, during her graduation ceremonies, upon finishing International Business Management Course, in the inveterate Strasbourg University

This significant training course was attended by a group of Kuwait's finest young people, graduates of Gulf University for Science and Technology (GUST).

Actually, accompanying my daughter Sheikha Sarah, may God protect her, was a great opportunity to closely get to know the French city of Strasbourg, and its ancient history, as well as to meet the university administration, and talk about the university history, which extends for about five centuries, back to the Renaissance era. During the 1970s, the university was divided into three educational institutions. Later, these divisions were remerged into one institution making one of the biggest oldest and best world universities. It is enough that many Nobel Prize laureates have

graduated from it. It was a great honor to visit the inveterate Strasbourg University Palace, built by the famous German architect Otto Warth, upon the orders of the German Emperor Wilhelm I. This great construction has turned into a symbol of power and knowledge, whereas its architect was inspired by the spirit of the European Renaissance in its design, through statues on the façade, honoring the pioneering figures in science and art, from the Renaissance to the nineteenth century.

Our second stop was a visit to the headquarters of the European Parliament, which is one of the three bodies, representing the legislative authority in the European Union. The significance of the Strasbourg headquarters is due to its location in the Alsace region, which was historically the subject of a dispute between France and Germany, and it turns to symbolize reconciliation between the two states.

Our third stop inside the ancient city was at the European Council in the Palace of Europe, which is an international organization, with the stated goal of supporting human rights, democracy, and the rule of law; whereas its most important body is the European Court, concerned with the application of human rights conventions

With the last stop, I return once again to my daughter, Sheikha/Sarah, may God protect her, and her graduation ceremony, which coincided with the birth anniversary of my beloved late son, the forgiven, God willing, Sheikh/Nasser Sabah Fahd Al-Sabah, may God have mercy on him and make Paradise his abode. It seems as if fate combined the two occasions in one day, the blessed Friday, as a consolation for me, in the company of my dear students. How badly I wished that my son Sheikh/ Nasser, may God have mercy on him and make Paradise his abode, would be

On this date every year, I would be at the Grand Mosque in Makkah, reciting the Holy Qur'an. Alternatively, this year I was in the Strasbourg University campus, with my dear

Kuwaiti students, attending the scholarship. They were a model of effort and dedication, and an honorable face for Kuwait, acting as the shield of the future and the soldiers of the homeland. Despite the weather fluctuations, they spared no effort and encouraged each other, in an atmosphere of gratitude and praise for the university administration, and their accompanied supervisors of the training course, the academic researcher/Sarah Hertzog, and Dr. Ahmed Al-Meligy, from GUST. This drew the attention of the university administration to this exceptional and distinguished class, which they described as having the morals of knights and the weapon of knowledge.

'Hold accountable everyone involved in nationality fraud'

"INDEED, the actions of the Supreme Committee for Nationality, led by First Deputy Prime Minister Sheikh Fahd Al-Yousef, Minister of Interior, and Minister of Defense, represent an unprecedented historic national effort," columnist and former deputy director-general of Kuwait News Agency (KUNA) Iqbal Al-Ahmed wrote for Al-Qabas daily.

"This is a comprehensive purification process aimed at restoring the integrity of the national identity,

which has been compromised by individuals and entities whose collective responsibility spans across various sectors.





continue to be, punished. Their unlawfully obtained citizenship, acquired through forgery and deception, are being revoked - a process that will undoubtedly persist, God willing.

"However, the pressing question on everyone's mind is: What about the other side involved in this citizenship forgery? Where are those who signed off on these illegal documents?

"Who approved the granting of citizenship to individuals who did not meet the required criteria? Who gave the green light to violate the law, abuse their power, and tarnish the national identify? Who authorized the opening of citizenship records to include those who were undeserving?

"Where are those responsible within the government, those in administrative roles with the power to prevent such violations but failed to do so?

"The term "responsible" encompasses multiple levels of authority -- individuals who have the power to make decisions and who opened the doors to forgery only upon their signal.

"It is relatively straightforward to hold accountable those who unlawfully benefited from a nationality they were not entitled to, even though they knew it was undeserved.

"But the real issue lies in the decisions made by higher authorities -those in command, under whose leadership employees and officials operate, yet lack the power or authority to question such decisions.

"These decisions were not made by ordinary citizens, but by individuals with substantial influence and control.

"Everyone involved must be held accountable. Please, ensure justice is served at all levels.

"Examining parliamentary systems reveals a significant phenomenon that warrants careful consideration and analysis, as it may highlight inherent flaws or structural issues within these systems," columnist, constitutional expert Dr Mohammed Al-Muqati wrote for **Al-Jarida** daily.

"This phenomenon illustrates that the actual functioning of parliamentary systems often produces outcomes contrary to their intended objectives.

"The foundational premise of the parliamentary system is the rotation of power, particularly concerning the executive authority.

"However, this emphasis on the executive branch points to a structural problem: the rotation of power should ideally extend to all branches of government to effectively fulfill its intended goals, which are intrinsically linked to the concept of the "rotation of power."
"This broader rotation should en-

compass all authorities, aligning with the principle of separation of powers.

"One of the primary aims of this principle is to establish a system of mutual oversight among the different authorities, thereby fostering a balance of power and preventing any single authority from overshadowing the others.

"Such balance is essential to guard against tyranny, individualism, and the encroachment of one branch over

"Despite the pivotal role of the "theory of rotation of power" in the objectives of parliamentary systems, the reality observed in most parliamentary practices today does not support or facilitate its realization.

"A critical observation made in this study is the failure to effectively achieve the "theory of rotation of power" concerning the executive authority. Instead of exhibiting stability and logical continuity throughout a parliamentary term -- typically spanning four to five years -- governments are often subject to frequent instability and discontinuity.

"This instability manifests in the form of multiple government formations within a single parliamentary term, with some parliaments witnessing as many as three to seven different governments.

"Such a pattern contradicts the principles of stability and ministerial continuity that are supposed to underpin the parliamentary system, where the executive authority is deemed its cor-

"As noted by Jennings in his seminal work, "The Cabinet Government," and echoed by the late Professor Othman Abdulmalik Al-Saleh in his analysis of Kuwait's constitutional system, the essential function of government necessitates a degree of stability and

"This stability is crucial for implementing the fundamental principle of the rotation of executive authority.

"However, if maintaining stability and continuity within the executive authority proves impossible -- as the reality in many parliamentary systems suggests -- then the foundational theory of rotating executive authority

"Consequently, the very theoretical framework upon which the parliamentary system is built becomes fundamentally compromised.'



"A hashtag recently became popular on social media, calling for the government to resign under the banner "The Government's Departure is a Popular Demand." This has sparked huge engagement among followers. We encourage all Kuwaiti citizens to express their views on government performance, especially in the absence of the National Assembly, which typically oversees the work of the Council of Ministers. Since its dissolution, public oversight has become prominent, with opinions being expressed either directly or through social media, with the support of the Kuwaiti Constitution's guarantee of freedom of expression," columnist **Talal Al-Saeed** wrote for **Al-Seyassah** daily.

"However, we must stop and think about this hashtag. Is the government's performance truly poor, warranting such a demand for its departure? Is this call based on solid reasoning, considering the government has had ample opportunity to prove itself? Or are these demands driven by recent government actions regarding citizenship, particularly the need to uphold national identity and address issues like the withdrawal of citizenship from fraudsters? Some had registered children who are not their own under their name in order for them to get citizenship on the basis of being children of Kuwaiti citizens. There are many such troubling stories that we keep hearing which can turn a newborn baby's hair white.

"Those affected by these measures and tremble when they think about what lies ahead are often the ones calling for the government's departure, believing it will halt citizenship withdrawal and scrutiny of citizenship files.

"This is a wrong conclusion. Even if the government were to resign, the minister of interior remains committed to completing his project. If he were to leave, the next minister could be even stricter, as safeguarding national identity has become a rallying point for loyal citizens. The concerns of the national majority have often been drowned out by the chaos and noise from dissolved councils.

"Today, the vision has become clear. It is essential to address the grievances of citizens who were wronged by forgery and improper naturalization, as they risk losing their national identity amidst the crowd.

"The re-examination of citizenship files is not just Sheikh Fahad Al-Yousef's initiative or that of the current government. It is an ongoing national project aimed at achieving its goals. Demanding the government's resignation or the minister of interior's departure will not alter the project's course. Such calls do not reflect a true popular demand.'

"No one sympathizes with criminals. Everyone who falls afoul of the law bears responsibility, including the bank employee arrested for allegedly stealing from depositors' accounts, despite the fact that no verdict has been issued yet," columnist Talal Al-Saeed

wrote for **Al-Seyassah** daily.
"Through social media, we are inundated with daily updates about this bank employee, detailing her case to such an extent that many of us can easily narrate the story by heart. It is important to note that she is still merely accused, and the charges against her

have yet to be proven. "What stands out is how her story dominates social media, repeated every morning as if she were the only person in Kuwait accused of theft, or as if she alone had reached into people's pockets, should the charges be

validated. "So, why is this particular employee the sole focus of such relentless atten-

"If someone wants to discuss theft or the full story of embezzlement of public funds, why not focus on the "theft" minister who was proven guilty, sentenced to prison, and ordered to return the stolen funds to the state treasury, along with a fine? He is not alone, as many former officials share a similar fate and could serve as important examples for discussion.

Why is the spotlight only on this bank employee, whose story continues to dominate social media? It is clear that we contribute to this narrative by endlessly supporting certain weak-willed officials, allowing them to believe they are above accountability. They overstepped and misappropriated public funds, yet even now, while incarcerated, they receive little attention.

"Meanwhile, the saga of the bank employee goes on. Why not hold all parties accountable?"

MoE's new educational initiative sparks debate

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 26: In a move that has sparked considerable discussion, the Ministry of Education is launching a new initiative aimed at increasing tax awareness among students, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

Amid ongoing debates regarding the government's potential tax reforms -- especially those linked to agreements within the Gulf Cooperation Council -- the ministry plans to allocate specific schools in each governorate for awareness lectures on

The Department of School Activities has tasked educational directors with selecting four schools from each educational district: two secondary schools and two intermediate schools.

This initiative is part of a broader effort by the Ministry of Finance to foster community understanding of taxation, reaching various segments of society, including young students.

On July 30, the Ministry of Finance reached out to the Ministry of Education, requesting assistance to facilitate this mission, emphasizing the importance of collaboration between However, this initiative has not gone unnoticed by critics as former MP Mohammed Hayef expressed concerns that the

Mother's 47-years jail, lover's 15 years upheld in child abuse case

Man accused of kidnap, sexual assault on 2 girls acquitted

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 26: The Court of Appeals has upheld the verdict issued by a lower court which sentenced a Kuwaiti woman to 47-year imprisonment, and her lover to 15-year imprisonment, with hard labor for injecting her 13-year-old daughter with insulin with the intent to kill her, and facilitating her friend's sexual assault of her daughter after discovering their illicit relationship.

The mother admitted during the investigations that the reason for committing the crime was to take revenge on her daughter after discovering her illicit relationship with her lover, and as a result, she deprived all her children of their basic rights.

The Public Prosecution demanded in its indictment report that the maximum penalty be imposed on the mother and her lover for the crime they committed, which is considered one of the most heinous crimes against humanity.

Man acquitted in kidnap case: The Criminal Court has acquitted an individual, known only as Al-Mazyoun, of abducting two girls, sexually assaulting them and trafficking them after he tricked them into accepting a job in exchange for an alluring monthly salary.

Expat fraudster held facing KD 14,000 fine with multiple travel bans imposed on him

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 26: The Capital Investigation Department has arrested an expatriate wanted by law. 18 travel bans were imposed on him for involvement in fraud cases and has been obligated by the concerned court to pay about KD 14,000, reports Al-Anba daily.

A security source revealed that the department received information about a 41-year-old expatriate implicated in a number of fraud cases staying in an apartment in the East. He said securitymen went to the apartment and arrested the expatriate.

The source added that a final court ruling obligated the accused to pay KD 13,962 under misdemeanor case no. 366/2024, indicating a total of 18 travel bans were imposed on the accused and has debts to many companies for issuing dud checks.

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 26: The Communication and Information Technology Regulatory Authority (CITRA) is preparing to implement an automated system project for frequency spectrum analysis.

According to informed sources, CITRA has requested regulatory authorities to contract with a company to execute the project, valued at KD 3.2 million, for completion within 16 months. The project aims to enhance the organized and effective performance of various wireless services by measuring the wireless monitoring systems of the frequency spectrum.

The frequency spectrum is considered a natural resource essential for providing a range of wireless communication services, including personal and public communications, wireless navigation, air and maritime communications, broadcasting, public safety, relief operations, and radio location determination.

Meanwhile, the State Audit Bureau (SAB) recently requested CITRA to provide a detailed breakdown of the winning bidder's prices, including all quantities, equipment, devices, and systems, along with the technical requirements and specifications.

CITRA indicated that SAB requested clarification regarding the bidder's experience of five years or more in monitoring the frequency spectrum. The experience documents submitted by the winning bidder did not include copies of the contracts mentioned in the disclosure, nor did they provide quantity and price schedules for those contracts.

Sources said SAB also sought an explanation of the reason behind preparing the tender for the second phase of the project to measure the coverage of mobile telecommunications networks.

The tender for measuring the frequency spectrum includes systems for assessing the coverage and performance of mobile telecommunications networks, which SAB deemed a redundancy and overlap of work between the two tenders.

1,133 new hires boost workforce

MEW hits 97.6% Kuwaitization rate

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 26: According to statistics from the Ministry of Electricity and Water, 1,133 Kuwaitis were appointed in the technical and administrative sectors in the last eight months of 2024.

The Kuwaitization rate reached 97.6 percent in August, up from 97.5 percent in January. The total number of employees reached 35,506, including 34,666 Kuwaitis and 840 non-Kuwaitis as of August

In comparison, the total number of employees in January was 34,395, comprising 33,533 Kuwaitis and 862 non-Kuwaitis. This reflects a decrease of 22 expatriates due to replacements and retirements during the specified period.

According to informed sources, appointments are proceeding in accordance with the annual requirements of the ministry's sectors, and their need for specific technical and administrative specializations and available job grades.

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 26: The Kuwait Society for Combating Smoking and Cancer has announced the upcoming international conference titled 'The scourge of smoking and conflict of interest', scheduled for Oct 27 and 28, reports Al-Jarida daily.

The conference will be held under the patronage of the Minister of Health, Dr. Ahmed Al-Awadhi.

Dr. Khaled Al-Saleh, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Association and Conference Chairman, stated that the event will focus on the economics of

tobacco, highlighting how it incentivizes many companies to promote smoking, particularly among groups vulnerable such as children. This poses significant risks for future generations.

Dr. Al-Saleh noted that the World Health Organization (WHO)

has conducted workshops on this topic emphasizing the need to curb tobacco promotion through economic and media strategies. He pointed out that Kuwait is among the pioneers in adopting this global initiative.

According to the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, approximately 5.8 million tons of tobacco was produced worldwide in 2022.

The WHO has classified the smoking epidemic as one of the most severe public health threats globally, with an estimated 1.25 billion tobacco users. Smoking results in over 7 million deaths each year from direct use and an additional 1.3 million from passive smokers.

The campaign targeted locations of high density presence of the displaced in Beirut, Mount Lebanon, Zahle in eastern Lebanon and Akkar in the north,

The relocated were handed food, hygiene materials, blankets and mattresses, totally sufficient for up to 10,000

Caretaker Prime Minister Najib Mikati denied on Thursday circulating news regarding the signing of a ceasefire proposal after a meeting with US Secretary of State Antoni Blinken and American mediator Amos Hochstein.

A statement by Mikati's office utterly refuted the news, adding that Mikati's announcement, after the joint statement of the US and allies calling for a ceasefire, that his country was in principle agreement to the notion; however, it remains to be seen whether the Israeli occupation would abide by international law regarding this particular situation.

Mikati took part earlier in an urgent meeting for the UNSC held on Wednesday on the request of France to discuss developments in the Israeli aggressors attack against Lebanon.

Lebanon, since Monday morning, had been subjected to heavy Israeli bombardment of towns in the south of the country, which caused the loss of lives and destruction to properties.

Charge de Affaires of Kuwait Em-

bassy in Lebanon Ahmad Arafa affirmed on Thursday that Kuwait has vital role in supporting the Lebanese people. This came in a statement for KUNA after his meeting with Kuwait Red Crescent Society (KRCS) Chairman Anwar Al-Hasawi.

KD2.158 million contract faces SAB scrutiny

KPA seeks yearly health insurance extension amid oversight concerns

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 26: Kuwait Ports Authority (KPA) has started taking steps to extend the health insurance contract for its employees and their families -- work injuries and life insurance -- for one year valued at KD 2.158 million.

Sources revealed that KPA has asked the State Audit Bureau (SAB) to extend the contract with the company that provides health insurance for em-

ployees and their families; indicating the bureau will not address the request unless KPA responds to its inquiries about the extension, especially since this will be the fifth extension.

Sources said SAB has confirmed that KPA did not abide by the rules governing entities subject to its oversight; such as the need for prior oversight and adherence to the guidelines for preparing tender documents, contract projects, engagements and agree-

On the other hand, sources affirmed

that SAB has agreed to extend the contract for the appointment of sailors in Shuwaikh, Doha and Shuaiba ports; as well as the marine operations, marine pollution and external and internal marine anchorage departments, for a period of 180 days at a total cost of KD

Sources pointed out this is the second extension and it began on June 11; adding that SAB stressed the need to complete the bidding, awarding and contracting of the new tender before

the extended period ends.

Europe

Russian missiles target Kyiv for 5 hours: Ukraine's air defenses battled an overnight Russian aerial attack on the capital Kyiv for five hours, officials said Thursday, as missiles and drones again hammered the Ukrainian power grid.

The Kyiv attack injured at least two people, Ukraine's Emergency Service said. A kindergarten, a gas pipe and around 20 cars were damaged in the city, said the Kyiv Military Ad-

Long-range strikes have been a hallmark of Russia's military campaign in Ukraine, now deep in its third year, often hitting civilian areas. Attacks on the electricity network have knocked out around 70% of Ukraine's energy generation capacity, according to the United Nations, bringing blackouts as winter approaches.

Energy infrastructure was hit in Ukraine's western Ivano-Frankivsk region, causing a blackout in parts of the regional capital of the same name, regional Gov Svitlana Onyshchuk said.

The power grid was also targeted in the southern Mykolaiv region, local authorities said without immediately providing further details.

Russia launched six missiles and 78 Shahed drones at Ukraine overnight from Wednesday to Thursday, Ukraine's air force said. Defenses destroyed four of the missiles and 66

drones in the air, it said. In the south, a missile killed a 62-yearold woman in the Odesa region, where homes and cars were damaged, regional Gov Oleh Kiper said. (AP)

Far-right party looks for historic win in Austria: Austria's far-right Freedom Party could win a national election for the first time when Austria votes on Sunday, tapping into voters' anxieties about immigration, inflation, Ukraine and other concerns following recent gains for the hard right elsewhere

Herbert Kickl, a former interior minister and longtime campaign strategist who has led the Freedom Party since 2021, wants to become Austria's new chancellor. He has used the term "Volkskanzler," or chancellor of the people, which was used by the Nazis to describe Adolf Hitler in the 1930s. Kickl has rejected the comparison.

And a win isn't certain, with recent polls pointing to a close race. They have put support for the Freedom Party at 27%, with the conservative Austrian People's Party of Chancellor Karl Nehammer on 25% and the center-left Social Democrats on 21%. (AP)

UK probes cyberattack on Wi-Fi networks: UK transport officials and police said Thursday they are investigating a "cyber-security incident" that hit the public Wi-Fi networks at the country's biggest railway stations. Passengers trying to log onto the Wi-Fi at stations including

Manchester Piccadilly, Birmingham New Street and 11 London terminuses on Wednesday evening were met by a page reading "We love you, Europe," followed by an anti-Islam message listing a series of terror attacks.

Network Rail, which manages the stations, said the Wi-Fi had been switched off and no passenger data was taken.

"British Transport Police are investigating the incident," Network Rail said in a statement. "This service is provided via a third party and has been suspended while an investigation is under way." (AP)

Labour members deal a blow to Starmer: Members of Britain's governing Labour Party dealt Prime Minister Keir Starmer a blow on Wednesday, rejecting his decision to cut payments that offset winter heating costs for millions of re-

The vote on the final day of Labour's annual conference is not binding, but it's a setback to Starmer's efforts to unite his center-left party around the contentious measure.

Since winning office in July, Starmer has cautioned that the dire ate of the pub ic finances inherited from the last (government means he must make hard choices such as ending the winter fuel allowance, worth between 200 and 300 pounds (\$262 and \$393), for all but the poorest pensioners.

Trade unions that are among Labour's funders and allies organized resistance to the cut at the conference in Liverpool, northwest England. They forced a vote on a demand for the decision to be reversed. It was narrowly passed in a show-ofhands vote amid cheers and jeers in the conference hall. (AP)

Czech PM proposes dismissal of minister: Czech Prime Minister Petr Fiala announced Tuesday that he will propose to President Petr Pavel the dismissal of Ivan Bartos from the post of Deputy Prime Minister for Digitization and Minister for Regional Development as of Sept. 30.

Fiala said Bartos is not able to bring the digitalization of construction procedures to a successful conclusion. According to a government statement, a special team led by the Minister of Transport Martin Kupka will be responsible for digitalization from Wednesday. The announcement came after Bartos said on Sunday that he would resign as the leader of the Pirate Party due to the party's poor performance in the regional elections held over the weekend. (Xinhua)

EU fails to dissuade African migrants: The European Union is failing develop ways to dissuade migrants from Africa leaving for Europe without authorization and could do more to limit abuses against people trying to make the journey, the

EU's financial watchdog warned on Wednesday. The findings come in a European Court of Auditors report into the bloc's Emergency Trust Fund for Africa, a multi-billion-euro program hastily set up in 2015 after more than 1 million migrants arrived on Europe's shores, many of them fleeing war in Syria, overwhelming services in Italy and Greece.

It was meant to help tackle the root causes of migration in Africa, like poverty, conflict or unemployment. At first, 1.8 billion euros (\$2 billion) was available to distribute on hundreds of projects, but that amount has swelled to about 5 billion euros (\$5.6 billion) today. (AP)

Norway detains man of inciting crimes: Norwegian police said Wednesday that they had detained a German national of Cameroonian heritage for allegedly inciting crimes against humanity in war-torn Cameroon, the first time Norway was embarking on legal proceedings for such crimes.

The man, who is in his 50s, lives in Norway but has not been named. He was detained because the National Criminal Investigation Service, known in Norway as KRIPOS, said that they believed he "had a central role in an ongoing armed conflict in

Anette Berger, the prosecutor in the case, said, "We are in an early phase of the investigation, and there are several investi-

On Wednesday, KRIPOS would seek his custody from the Oslo District Court "on the basis of the risk of tampering with evidence." (AP)

'Hand over gunmen who attacked police': Kosovar Prime Minister Albin Kurti on Tuesday held Serbia accountable for trying to annex part of Kosovo following an incursion of Serb gunmen who killed a police officer in a shootout last year that raised tensions between the sides.

Kurti called on the international community to press Belgrade to hand over the gunmen who retreated to Serbia following a 12-hour standoff at a Serbian Orthodox monastery at Banjska, 55 kilometers (30 miles) north of the capital Pristina.

Serbia is responsible and Serbia should be held accountable," said Kurti. Kurti said the paramilitary group was "orchestrated and financed from Serbia" and had earlier brought to Kosovo a large quantity of weaponry "for a wider and longer conflict." (AP)

Helene upgraded to Category 2 hurricane as it barrels toward Florida

Fast-moving Hurricane Helene was advancing Thursday across the Gulf of Mexico toward Florida, threatening an "unsurvivable" storm surge in northwestern parts of the state as well as damaging winds, rains and flash floods hundreds of miles inland across much of the southeastern US, forecasters said.

Helene was upgraded Thursday morning to a Category 2 storm and is expected to be a major hurricane - meaning a Category 3 or higher - when it makes landfall on Florida's northwestern coast Thursday evening. As of early Thursday, hurricane warnings and flash flood warnings extended far beyond the coast up into south-central Georgia. The

governors of Florida, Georgia, and the Carolinas

have all declared emergencies in their states.

The storm was expected to make landfall in the Big Bend region, where Florida's panhandle and peninsula meet, according to Jack Beven, senior hurricane specialist at the National Hurricane Center in Miami. (AP)

NYC Mayor Adams indicted: New York City Mayor Eric Adams has been indicted by a grand jury on federal criminal charges, according to two people familiar with the matter, an extraordinary culmination to weeks of searches, subpoenas and resigna-tions of top officials that have thrust the city's government into crisis.

The indictment detailing the charges against Adams, a Democrat, was expected to be unsealed Thursday, according to the people, who spoke with The Associated Press on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to discuss the matter publicly. The U.S. attorney's office in Manhattan declined to comment.

In a speech recorded at his official residence, Adams said he would remain in office, describing any charges he may face as 'entirely false, based on lies."

Federal investigators had seized Adams' electronic devices nearly a year ago as part of an investigation focused, at least partly, on campaign contributions and Adams' interactions with the Turkish government.

Ex-officer convicted of murder: A for-

mer Houston police officer was convicted Wednesday of murder in the deaths of a couple during a 2019 drug raid that revealed systemic corruption problems within the police department's narcotics unit. A jury found Gerald Goines guilty of

two counts of murder in the January 2019 deaths of Dennis Tuttle, 59, and his 58-yearold wife Rhogena Nicholas. The couple, along with their dog, were fatally shot after officers burst into their home using a "noknock" warrant that didn't require them to announce themselves before entering.

Trump says Ukraine 'demolished'

WASHINGTON, Sept 26, (Agencies): Former US president Donald Trump described Ukraine in bleak and mournful terms Wednesday, referring to its people as "dead" and the country itself as "demolished," and further raising questions about how much the former president would be willing if elected again to concede in a negotiation over the country's future.

Trump argued Okraine should have made concessions to Russian President Vladimir Putin in the months before Russia's February 2022 attack, declaring that even "the worst deal would've been better than what we have now."

Trump, who has long been critical of US aid to Ukraine, frequently claims that Russia never would have invaded if he was president and that he would put an end to the war if he returned to the White House. But rarely has he discussed the conflict in such detail.

His remarks, at a North Carolina event billed as an economic speech, come on the heels of a debate this month in which he pointedly refused to say whether he wanted Ukraine to win the war. On Tuesday, Trump touted the prowess of Russia and its predecessor Soviet Union, saying that wars are 'what they do."

The Republican former president, notoriously attuned to slights, began his denunciation of Ukraine by alluding to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's recent criticism of Trump and running mate JD Vance.

AU expresses concern over security in Sudan

ADDIS ABABA, Ethiopia, Sept 26, (Agencies): African Union (AU) Commission Chairperson Moussa Faki Mahamat expressed concern over the deterio-

rating security and humanitarian situation in Sudan.

The chairperson of the 55-member organization, in a statement issued Tuesday, expressed "grave concern" regarding the security and humanitarian situa-tion in the conflict-affected Sudan, with particular emphasis on the situation in El Fasher, Darfur.

Condemning the recent escalation of the crisis and the spread of violence, Faki called for an immediate cessation of the fighting across Sudan.

He further reiterated the AU's conviction that there can be no military solution to the crisis in Sudan. He



said the ongoing "unjustified fighting" only prolongs the suffering of all Sudanese people and the devastation of the country after decades of conflict and forced displacement.

Sudan has been embroiled in a deadly conflict between the Sudanese Armed Forces and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces since mid-April 2023.

Faki urged the two warring parties and their allies "to immediately and unconditionally

embrace a permanent and comprehensive ceasefire. He said a permanent and comprehensive ceasefire would pave the way for an inclusive all-Sudanese political dialogue to address the deep-rooted causes of the conflict and reset Sudan toward constitutional democratic order and stability.

He further reiterated the AU's commitment to contribute with all means at its disposal to ending the conflict through various African mechanisms, including the High-Level Panel on Sudan and the AU Special Envoy for the Prevention of Genocide.

As the 79th session of the United Nations General Assembly convenes in New York, the AU Commission chairperson also renewed the call for effective unification of efforts for collective international action to solve this extremely dangerous crisis in Sudan.

S.Africa fighters remains arrive home: The remains of 42 South African freedom fighters who died while exiled in Zimbabwe and Zambia during the struggle against white minority rule arrived in their home country Wednesday.

The remains were received by government officials and family members at Waterkloof Air Force Base in the capital Pretoria after being exhumed for reburial in the country of their birth.

This was part of a government program to bring closure to families, whose loved ones died away from home while serving in the underground structures of both the African National Congress and Pan Africanist Congress, according to officials.

Before the apartheid system ended in South Africa in 1994, many activists left the country to receive military training elsewhere with the aim of returning home to wage an armed struggle.

Others left the country to avoid being arrested by the apartheid regime for their involvement in anti-apartheid activities, and chose Zimbabwe and Zambia where the underground structures were the

After it was banned in South Africa, the African National Congress party of Nelson Mandela, shifted its headquarters to the Zambian capital, Lusaka.

Many died in exile and were buried in those coun-

Among the remains returned to South Africa were those of freedom struggle stalwarts Duma Nokwe, Florence Mophosho and Basil February.

Speaking during a Heritage Day event in South Africa on Tuesday, South Africa's Deputy President Paul Mashatile said the repatriation was part of efforts to teach future generations about the role played by many in the struggle against apartheid.

Free political prisoners in Congo: Hundreds protested in front of Congo's top court Wednesday to demand the release of political prisoners, including the country's three most prominent opposition figures imprisoned on charges the opposition says are politi-

cally motivated.

Felix Tshisekedi, the president of the central African country which has a history riddled with political turmoil, was reelected in December with results questioned by the opposition. He has spent much of his time in office trying to gain legitimacy after a disputed 2018 election while struggling to quell violence in the country's east to the disgruntlement

Protesters in the capital, Kinshasa, held banners that read, "Release political prisoners", with some chanting "Tshisekedi, you have killed our country!" Others

barricaded and occupied the court's entrance. After the protest ended, representatives of several opposition parties handed the minister of justice a statement that accused Tshisekedi of trying to "muzzle the opponents" and to "silence dissenting voices.

"We came to see the minister of justice to tell him that it is not normal that in a state governed by the rule of law, there are political prisoners who are imprisoned unjustly," Fiston Mayas, a member of the main opposition party Together for the Republic, told The Associated Press.

The parties called for the release of Jean-Marc Kabund, leader of the Alliance for Change party, Mike Mukebayi, a former member of the provincial parliament for Together for the Republic and Seth Kikuni, a candidate in the presidential elections last year.

'Eswatini main opp'n leader poisoned': Eswatini's main opposition leader was poisoned in an assassination attempt, his party claimed Wednesday, putting renewed scrutiny on the southern African country that is one of the last remaining absolute monarchies and where authorities have for years moved to quash pro-democracy movements.

The People's United Democratic Movement party (PUDEMO) said its president, Mlungisi Makhanya, was hospitalized after being poisoned in neighboring South Africa on Tuesday. It said he was under security protection but gave no more detail on his condition or the circumstances of the alleged poisoning.

Makhanya had recently said there would be new pro-democracy protests in Eswatini next month. Eswatini government spokesperson Alpheous Nxu-

malo denied any involvement. King Mswati III rules Eswatini, a country of 1.2 million, with power over all branches of the government. The 56-year-old has been king since he succeeded his father in 1986 at the age of 18.

DomRep to take measures: The president of the Dominican Republic warned Wednesday that his administration would take "drastic measures" to protect the country if a UN-backed mission in neighboring Haiti targeting gang violence fails.

Luis Abinader did not provide details of what action he might take during his speech at the UN General Assembly in

Gangs in Haiti control 80% of the capital, Port-au-Prince, and they have grown more powerful since the July 2021 assassination of President Jovenel Moïse. More than 3,600 people have been reported killed during the first half of this year, a more than 70% increase compared with the same period last year. The violence also has left nearly 700,000 Haitians homeless in recent years and thousands have fled Haiti, which shares the island of Hispaniola with the Dominican Republic.

Abinader thanked Kenya, which is leading the mission in Haiti with nearly 400 police officers from the East African country recently joined by nearly two dozen police and soldiers from Jamaica and two senior military officers from Belize. Another 300 police from Kenya are expected to deploy within a month.

The personnel, however, falls significantly short of the 2,500 pledged by various countries for the mission, which the US government warns is lacking resources as it considers a possible U.N. peacekeeping mission.

Abinader said the current mission needs to be fully established so that free and transparent elections can be held. Haiti has not held elections since 2016, and a transitional presidential council was ordered to do so by February 2026.

"Practically one year from the holding of elections, the conditions are still not in place to do so," Abinader said as he expressed concern over the future of the mission. "We cannot allow the effort made to date to fail. If that were to happen, Haiti's collapse would be imminent.'

Earlier this year, gangs launched coordinated attacks targeting critical government infrastructure. They raided more than two dozen police stations, opened fire on the main international airport, forcing it to close for nearly three months, and stormed Haiti's two biggest prisons, releasing roughly $4{,}000$ inmates. SEOUL, South Korea, Sept 26, (AP): North Korea has likely enriched enough uranium to build a "double-digit" number of bombs and is making progress in its efforts to develop more powerful and accurate missiles targeting rival South Korea, Seoul's spy agency told lawmakers on Thursday.

The closed-door parliamentary briefing by the National Intelligence Service came after North Korea offered a rare glimpse into a secretive facility to produce weapons-grade uranium earlier this month as leader Kim Jong Un reiterated his goal to "exponentially" increase his stock of nucle-

The South Korean agency assessed that Kim's disclosure of the facility was likely a statement of defiance toward Washington ahead of the U.S. presidential election and

When asked about North Korea's bomb fuel capacity, the agency said North Korea likely has about 70 kilograms (154 pounds) of plutonium and an unspecified but considerable amount of weapons-grade uranium that would be enough to build "at least a double-digit number" of

and electric vehicles, reports Al-Seyassah daily.
In a statement to KUNA on the occasion of the organization's release of a new study titled "The reality and future prospects of critical minerals and the role of Arab countries in securing supply chains," Al-Loughain called for the enhancement of national and regional strategies to ensure the supply of these minerals and to develop the necessary infrastructure for their utilization He pointed out that critical minerals like nickel, lithium, cobalt, and copper are the backbone of the clean energy sector, as they are essential for manufacturing storage batteries, wind turbines, and other requirements of the

clean energy industry.

Al-Loughain noted that global investments in critical minerals are not keeping pace with the rising global demand. The required investments between 2022 and 2030 are estimated to range between \$360 billion and \$460 billion, indicating a significant investment gap of between

\$180 billion and \$270 billion.

Regarding geopolitical and economic risks, he mentioned that the concentration of supplies of many critical minerals in a limited number of countries exposes supply

Therefore, there is a need to strengthen international cooperation and develop more flexible trade policies to mitigate these risks and achieve sustainable supply chains.

Concerning the increasing demand and future forecasts, he stated that projections indicate a significant rise in global demand for critical minerals by 2050, driven by the growing reliance on low-carbon clean energy

Experts warn of market risks

Gold hits all-time high amidst global uncertainty

NEW YORK, Sept 26, (AP): The rush for gold just keeps coming.

Gold hit another all time high this week. Recent gains for the precious metal are largely credited to ongoing economic uncertainty, geopolitical tensions and strong demand from central banks around the world.

If trends continue, analysts have bullish outlooks on the price of gold for the months ahead. But the future is never promised. Here's what you need to know.

The New York spot price of gold closed Tuesday at just over \$2,657 per Troy ounce - the standard for measuring precious metals, which is equivalent to 31 grams the highest recorded to date, per FactSet. That would make a gold bar or brick weighing 400 Troy ounces worth more than \$1.06 million today.

This week's record high means that the price of gold has climbed hundreds of dollars per Troy ounce over the last year. Tuesday's price is up nearly \$145 from a month ago and more than \$740 from this time in 2023

The price of gold is up nearly 30% year to date, analysts note - outpacing the benchmark S&P 500's roughly 20% gain since the start of 2024.

There are a few factors behind the recent gains.

Interest in buying gold often comes at times of uncertainty with potential concerns around inflation and the strength of the U.S. dollar, for example, causing some to look for alternative places to park their money. Gold also surged in the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Among sources of uncertainty today are geopolitical tensions which escalated over recent days with Israel's deadly strikes in Lebanon. And the ongoing wars in Gaza and Ukraine have continued to fuel fears about the future worldwide.

In markets like the U.S., there's also particular concern about the health of the job market. Last week's larger-than-usual halfpoint cut by the Federal Reserve signals a new focus on slowing employment numbers, and more rate cuts are expected before the end of the year. And such action arrives in the midst of a tumultuous election year - which could prove crucial to economic policy in the road ahead, too.

In the near future, people are considering "any case of turbulence in the economy," FxPro senior market analyst Michel Saliby explained. "This is why they're keeping a decent portion of gold in their portfolio as a 'safe haven."

Analysts also point to strong demand from central banks around the world. Joe Cavatoni, senior market strategist at the World Gold Council, noted last month that central bank demand was well-above the five year average - reflecting "heightened concern with inflation and economic stability.'

Recent stimulus measures in China aimed at boosting consumer spending are also expected to up retail investments, Saliby added, further boosting gold's performance.

Advocates of investing in gold call it a "safe haven," arguing the commodity can serve to diversify and balance your investment portfolio, as well as mitigate possible risks down the road. Some also take comfort in buying something tangible that has the potential to increase in value over time.

Experts caution against putting all your eggs in one basket.

Both retail and institutional investors shouldn't be influenced by the "FOMO effect," or fear of missing out, Saliby notes - explaining that people should not risk all their money just because they are seeing others rake in gains. He advises investors to watch the market and always have a clear risk management strategy for their position.

If geopolitical tensions cool, Saliby expects the price of gold to correct slightly, perhaps falling around \$50 to \$80. But he remains bullish overall for the near future expecting gold's spot price to soon surpass the \$2,700 mark previously predicted for 2025, and perhaps reach as high as \$2,800 or \$2,900 if trends continue.

Still, future gains are never promised and not everyone agrees gold is a good investment. Critics say gold isn't always the inflation hedge many say it is - and that there are more efficient ways to protect against potential loss of capital, such as through derivative-based investments.

The Commodity Futures Trade Commission has also previously warned people to be wary of investing in gold. Precious metals can be highly volatile, the commission said, and prices rise as demand goes up - meaning "when economic anxiety or instability is high, the people who typically profit from precious metals are the

If you do choose to invest in gold, the commission adds, it's important to educate yourself on safe trading practices and be cautious of potential scams and counterfeits on the market.

88 real estate contracts registered in Kuwait

Kuwait real estate contracts total KD 40.05 million from Sept 16-19

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 26: Between Sept 16 and 19, 2024, the total value of real estate contracts registered with the Ministry of Justice in Kuwait reached approximately 40.05 million dinars, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

According to the Real Estate Registration and Documentation Department statistics, a total of 88 contracts were executed during this period, with transactions occurring across all six governorates.

The breakdown of the contracts included 64 private real estate contracts valued at 30.17 million dinars, 22 investment properties worth 6.33 million dinars, a craft sector property at 1.7 million dinars, and an exhibition sector property valued at 1.85 million dinars.

However, there were no recorded transactions for commercial, industrial, coastal strip, or warehouse real estate during this week. In comparison, the total value of real estate contracts registered from Sept 8 to 12, 2024, was about 86.52 million dinars.

Additionally, the local banks' financing for the real estate sector saw an increase of 125.1 million dinars (or 23.8 percent) in July, bringing the total to 649.6

ASEAN+3 trade reaches over USD 1 trln in '23

Laos' Minister of Industry and Commerce, Malaythong Kommasith revealed Tuesday the trade between ASEAN and its key partners, China, Japan and South Korea, reached more than USD 1 trillion in 2023, representing 32.1 percent of ASE-AN's total trade value.

This was revealed in Kommasith's opening remarks during the 27th ASEAN+3 Consultation, held in Vientiane, stressing that the Plus Three countries are not only

ASEAN's top trading partners, but also the second-largest foreign direct investors.

In 2023, foreign direct investment (FDI) from Čhina, Japan and South Korea amounted to USD 42.8 billion, accounting for 18.6 percent of FDI in ASEAN.

"Our trade and investment links with the Plus Three countries are solid, and we hope to further strengthen these ties with the implementation of our new economic cooperation plans," added Kommasith.

In the meeting, discussions on deepening economic integration, promoting participatory and sustainable development, and advancing digital technology to enhance regional trade took place.

The meeting also reviewed the progress of the 2023-2024 economic cooperation plan and discussed new initiatives for 2025-

3 OpenAI execs are leaving the ChatGPT maker

A high-ranking executive at OpenAl who served a few days as its interim CEO during a period of turmoil last year said she's leaving the artificial intelligence company.

Mira Murati, OpenAl's chief technology officer, said in a written statement Wednesday that, after much reflection, she has "made the difficult decision to leave OpenAl.

"I'm stepping away because I want to create the time and space to do my own exploration," she said.

Two other top executives are also on their way out, CEO Sam Altman announced later Wednesday. The decisions by Murati, as well as OpenAl's Chief Research Officer Bob McGrew and another research leader, Barret Zoph, were made "independently of each other and amicably," Altman said in a note to employees he shared on social media.

They are the latest high-profile departures from San Franciscobased OpenAI, which started as a nonprofit research laboratory and is best known for making Chat-GPT. Its president and co-founder, Greg Brockman, said in August he was "taking a sabbatical" through the end of the year. Another co-founder, John Schulman, left in August for rival Anthropic, founded in 2021 by a group of ex-OpenAl leaders. (ÁP)

Warning on risks from trade sanctions

Asian Development Bank raises growth forecast for region

KUALA LUMPUR, Sept 26, (AP): Developing economies in Asia are forecast to grow at a 5.0% annual pace this year, helped by a strong U.S. economy and surging demand for computer chips that power artificial intelligence, the Asian Development Bank said in a report Wednesday.

The forecast was revised upward slightly from the ADB's April estimate of 4.9% growth.

However, the regional lender warned of the potential threat of more protectionist measures, such as higher tariffs on exports from China, depending on the outcome of the U.S. presidential election.

The report highlighted several positive trends, including a rebound in exports from Asia of computer chips and other advanced electronics this year due to rapid adoption of artificial intelligence. It also noted that energy and food prices are moderating, though inflation remains painfully high in countries such as Pakistan, Laos and Myanmar.

The upturn in global demand for semiconductors

and related electronics materials and components has helped drive stronger growth in Taiwan, Hong Kong, Singapore and South Korea, and to a lesser extent, the Philippines and Thailand, and that trend is expected to

The report cited data from World Semiconductor Trade Statistics projecting that spending on memory chips, vital for AI applications, will expand 77% this year.

Other types of exports, especially autos from China and South Korea, also are growing quickly, it said. The U.S. presidential election is a major source of un-

"The election could result in higher blanket tariffs by the U.S. on all global imports, and a broad-based and steep increase in tariffs on all U.S. imports from the PRC (China)," the report said. "This would significantly escalate U.S.-PRC trade tensions, with potential negative

spillovers to developing Asia through real and financial

Former President Donald Trump has pledged to stop U.S. businesses from shipping jobs overseas and to take other countries' jobs and factories away by relying heavily on sweeping tariffs. Vice President Kamala Harris has criticized Trump's plan to impose large tariffs on most imported goods, which she says would severely raise the cost of goods.

Asia's developing economies are also vulnerable to other U.S. moves that might affect their currencies or the cost of borrowing on foreign loans, the report said.

China's ailing property market remains a key risk and the report kept its forecasts for growth for the world's second-largest economy at 4.8% in 2024 and 4.5% next year. The ADB's chief economist, Albert Park, welcomed a flurry of fresh measures announced Tuesday by Beijing to cut borrowing costs and encourage more home

"It's good to see. Certainly there's room for monetary policy expansion," he told reporters in a briefing before the report's release. "Whether that will work remains to

Among other positive developments, the report noted that energy inflation has returned to levels seen before the COVID-19 pandemic began in 2020. That alleviates pressures on some economies that depend heavily on imports of oil and other fuels, such as Sri Lanka, China and

Food inflation is still slightly higher, but falling. Rice prices fell by 12% to \$589 per metric ton in late August after hitting a 16-year peak of \$669 per metric ton in late January, the report said.

They are expected to fall further, as rice harvests are projected to hit record levels in the 2024-2025 growing year, and prices for wheat and maize also have declined. Crops are likely to benefit from the La Nina climate phenomenon, which could bring beneficial higher rainfall to some regions though it also could cause destructive flooding in others.

Global economy growth stabilizes at 3.2 percent in 2024, 2025: OECD

GDP rise in US is projected to slow down to 2.6% this year

PARIS, Sept 26, (Xinhua): Global gross domestic product (GDP) growth is projected to stabilize at 3.2 percent in both 2024 and 2025, while inflation should continue to ease, the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and **Development (OECD) said** on Wednesday in its latest economic outlook.

According to the OECD economic outlook, annual GDP growth in the United States is proiected to slow down to 2.6 percent in 2024 and further down to 1.6 percent in 2025, but be cushioned by monetary policy easing.

For Euro area, the OECD said that GDP growth is projected to be 0.7 percent in 2024 and speed up to 1.3 percent in 2025, with activity supported by a recovery in real incomes and an improvement in credit avail-

Headline inflation has continued to fall this year in most countries, partly due to further declines in food price inflation and low or negative energy and goods price inflation, the organisation noted, adding that the recent steep fall in oil prices, and the ongoing easing of global food prices could place further downward pressure on headline inflation in the short-term.

"Oil prices have declined by over 10 percent since July, amid expectations for excess supply next year and market concerns about weakening oil demand growth ... If oil prices remain at their current level, global headline inflation could be reduced by around 0.5 percentage points over the coming year," the OECD explained.

According to the OECD, declining consumer price inflation has supported household spending, providing a counterbalance to the negative impact from restrictive financial conditions and the uncertainty about the ongoing Ukraine conflict and the evolving crisis in the Middle East.

Along with stable GDP growth and further disinflation, the OECD also said that real incomes would improve and less restrictive monetary policy in many economies would help underpin demand.

The recovery in real incomes could provide a stronger boost to consumer confidence and spending, and further oil price declines would hasten disinflation. Headline inflation is projected to

Deal goes ahead

Steelworkers lose bid to block US Steel sale

PITTSBURGH, Sept 26, (AP): An arbitration board has ruled that U.S. Steel may proceed with its proposed acquisition by Nippon Steel, a deal that faces strong opposition from its workforce.

The board, which was jointly chosen by U.S. Steel and the United Steelworkers to decide disputes between them, said Wednesday that U.S. Steel has satisfied each of the conditions of the successorship clause of its basic labor agreement with the union. It determined that no further action under the agreement was necessary in order to proceed with the closing of the proposed transaction with Nippon Steel.

USW had filed a series of grievances in January alleging that the successorship clause had not been satisfied. The union has previously stated that it doesn't believe Nippon fully understands its commitment to steelworkers, retirees and its communities. USW has expressed concern about the enforcement of its labor agreements, having transparency into Nippon's finances, as well as national defense, infrastructure and supply-chain issues.

The arbitration board heard evidence and arguments from U.S. Steel and USW last month.

The board said Wednesday that it recognized the repeated written commitments Nippon made to fulfill the requirements of the successorship clause and that no further action's were required by the company. The written commitments include Nippon's pledge to invest at least \$1.4 billion in USW-represented facilities, not to conduct layoffs or plant closings during the term of the basic labor agreement, and to protect the best interests of U.S. Steel in trade matters.

"With the arbitration process now behind us, we look forward to moving ahead with our pending transaction with Nippon Steel," U.S. Steel President and CEO David Burritt said in a statement.

USW said in a statement on Wednesday that it disagreed with the arbitration board's result. "Nippon's commitment to our

facilities and jobs remains as uncertain as ever, and executives in Tokyo can still change U.S. Steel's business plans and wipe them away at any moment," the union said. "We're clearly disappointed with the decision, but it does nothing to change our opposition to the deal or our resolve to fight for our iobs and communities that hang in the balance in this transaction.

President Joe Biden has previously voiced his opposition to Nippon Steel buying U.S. Steel, but the federal government appears to be in no hurry to block the deal.

Earlier this month White House officials did not deny that the president would formally block the acquisition. But the necessary report from the government's Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States has yet to be submitted to the White House.

The proposed takeover carries some heavy political weight in Pennsylvania, a state that both Vice President Kamala Harris and Donald Trump view as a must-win in November's presidential election. U.S. Steel is headquartered in Pittsburgh.

Biden, Harris and Trump have all come out against the deal. Harris spoke at the Economic Club of Pittsburgh on Wednesday where she pledged to build an economy that is both pro-business and helps the middle class.

China's firms sustain momentum

BEIJING, Sept 26, (Xinhua): China's listed companies have seen improvement in performance quarter by quarter since the beginning of this year, with service consumption, export growth and new economic drivers contributing to the recovery trend.

A total of 5,104 companies listed on the Shanghai and Shenzhen bourses saw their combined profits decrease by only 0.4 percent from a year earlier in the second quarter, significantly improving from a drop of 4.5 percent in the first quarter, according to their latest half-year financial reports.

Listed firms have seen narrowing declines in profits and a drop in the proportion of loss-making companies, their reports showed. Nearly 80 percent of the listed firms reported profits while around 50 percent of the companies experienced profit growth in the first half.

Experts held that Chinese listed firms, whose revenue accounted for 56.5 percent of the country's GDP in the first six months, serve as a window to observe new trends in the country's economic development.

Recovery in consumption and ex-

Despite rising challenges from home and abroad, China's economy expanded 5 percent year on year in the first half, putting the country on track to hit its full-year economic growth target of around 5 percent.

During this period, service consumption has continued to recover, supported by robust travel and tourism growth. Airport companies reported a year-on-year rise of 20.7 percent in revenue.

Commodity consumption has also seen positive signs, with net profits of listed companies in sectors such as food and beverage, consumer electronics and automobile rising by 14.1 percent, 24.4 percent and 22.7 percent, respectively.

Moreover, listed companies have increasingly tapped into international markets, with improving competitiveness in overseas markets. In the first six months. China's exports in goods rose 6.9 percent year on year, while the overseas revenue of listed companies surged by 13.4 percent.

ISLAMABAD, Sept 26, (AP): The executive

board of the International Monetary Fund has approved a new \$7 billion loan for cash-strapped Pakistan, authorities said Wednesday, more than two months after the two sides said they had reached an agreement.

The loan - which Islamabad will receive in installments over 37 months - is aimed at boosting Pakistan's ailing economy, officials added.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in a statement hailed the deal that his team had been negotiating with the IMF since June. He thanked Kristalina Georgieva, the head of the IMF and her team, for the approval.

The global lender said its immediate disburse-

ment will be about \$1 billion.

In a statement issued Thursday, it praised Pakistan for taking key steps to restore economic stability. Growth has rebounded, inflation has fallen to single digits, and a calm foreign exchange market have allowed the rebuilding of reserve buffers.

But it also criticized authorities. The IMF warned that, despite the progress, Pakistan's vulnerabilities and structural challenges remained

It said a difficult business environment, weak governance, and an outsized role of the state hindered investment, while the tax base remained

"Spending on health and education has been

insufficient to tackle persistent poverty, and inadequate infrastructure investment has limited economic potential and left Pakistan vulnerable to the impact of climate change," it warned.

The development comes more than two months after the IMF reached a staff-level agreement with Pakistan for the new loan. It also came a day after officials said the global lender's executive board would approve the loan on Wednesday, adding that Pakistan had met all the conditions set by the lender.

Pakistan for decades has been relying on IMF loans to meet its economic needs.

Sharif thanked China and other friendly countries for facilitating Pakistan's deal with the IMF.



Balmain's whimsy meets minimalism of Courrèges

PARIS, Sept 26, (AP): Olivier Rousteing opened Balmain's Wednesday show at Paris Fashion Week with an audacious angular micro-gown - a glittering number featuring peaked shoulders, humped hips and a massive clasping hand motif. It was clear from the start: this season's Balmain was not going to be a study in subtlety Meanwhile,



Nicolas Felice's offering for Courrèges took the audience into a futuristic world. Here highlights Wednesday's

Rousteing. ever the showman, leaned into extremes, delivering a collection that unapologetically fused boldness with

a dose of camp.
Prints of half-painted women's faces guided the eye down floor-length gowns, while disembodied eyes, lips, noses and nails formed the visual leitmotifs of the evening. At its core, this collection's identity hinged on the sculptural, almost scaffolded, shoulders - a signature of Balmain's power dressing reimagined yet again. The peaking effect extended to the hips in gold-striped chain mini-dresses, evoking an exaggerated 1980s glamour.

Not every look hit the mark, however. A pink-beige conical suit suffered from wonky asymmetry, with a bustline that seemed comically repelled by the garment itself, a reminder of Rousteing's tendency to overindulge in his maximalist ambitions. As with past collections, the lack of restraint occasionally detracted from the overall coherence, a critique that has followed him across seasons.

That said, there were moments of pure fun and theatricality, such as a cream skirt with a 3D face peering out, a delightful nod to Rousteing's penchant for surrealist humor. This playful audacity keeps the Balmain faithful coming back, even when some pieces falter under the weight of their own excess. Rousteing's balancing act between bold experimentation and structural precision remains his triumph and Achilles'

Silhouettes

In many ways, this collection echoed themes in his archive: an obsession with exaggerated silhouettes, a love for sculptural shoulders, and a desire to embed his personal narrative into the fabric of his designs. But as always with Balmain, the risk and

spectacle are as much a part of the show as the clothes themselves. This time, Rousteing leaned heavily into both. Whether all his risks paid off is up for debate, but one thing is certain: subtlety was never on the agenda.

Di Felice took the audience into a space-age world, with models circling a black abyss inside the Carreau du Temple in Paris' Marais. The minimalism that has become his signature was on full display, but the subtle and unexpected touches provided a signature off-kilter, fashionforward kick. In a collection starting with black and charcoal hues, trapeze silhouette dresses featured slits instead of sleeves, allowing models to reveal their arms in a cool, confident gesture. The looks exuded a slick, rebellious sensuality, paired with black turtlenecks and knee-high, skintight boots. Ubiquitous wrap-around shades made the models seem untouchable, too cool for school.

Yet, this wasn't just a simplistic exercise in minimalism. Di Felice's knack for combining sensuality with technical prowess elevated the collection. The geometric halter necks and precise cuts in the dresses -often with lopped-off shoulders - gave the silhouettes a surgical quality, while unexpected lengths in the backs of skirts and thick, loosely flapping hems kept the collection fresh.

The spirit of André Courrèges, the '60s visionary who defined the Space Age, was alive. Di Felice's nod to that era came in nipped, slim-shoul-dered gowns in white and slightly flared pants - echoes of Courrèges legacy reimagined. Exposed midriffs, another '60s reference, were revisited with a modern, daring twist: a simple strap across the bust like a fashion hyphen, elegant in its minimalism.

Di Felice's style lies in his ability to evoke a sense of intimacy without jumping on the "naked dressing" trend, which has been the talk of the fashion world. Instead, he stays true to his slyly-coded version of Parisian chic, subtly provocative without be-

ing over the top.

Dries Van Noten's first collection since the eponymous designer stepped down in June dared to walk the tightrope between innovation and heritage. The runway was a testament to Van Noten's influence, weaving together historical references with futuristic silhouettes in a display that felt both familiar and fresh.

The show opened with a loose silhouetted snake-print coat, its deconstructed 1920s vibe setting the tone for the collection. This was no mere nostalgia trip, though. A trench coat, accentuated by bold black hems, recalled the graphic sensibilities of a video game or an animated classic like "Tintin."

This time there's singing, dancing and mayhem

'Joker' is back with Lady Gaga

VENICE, Italy, Sept 26, (AP): "Joker" is a hard act to follow. Todd Phillips' dark, Scorsese-inspired character study about the Batman villain made over a billion dollars at the box office, won Joaquin Phoenix his first Oscar, dominated the cultural discourse for months and created a new movie landmark.

It wasn't for everyone, but it got under peo-

Knowing that it was a fool's errand to try to do it again, Phillips and Phoenix pivoted, or rather, pirouetted into what would become "Joker: Folie à Deux." The dark and fantastical musical journey goes deeper into the mind of Arthur Fleck as he awaits trial for murder and falls in love with a fellow Arkham inmate, Lee, played by Lady Gaga. There is singing, dancing and mayhem.

If Phillips and Phoenix have learned anything over the years, it's that the scarier something is, the better. So once again they rebelled against expectations and went for broke with something that's already sharply divided critics.

As with the first, audiences will get to decide for themselves when it opens in theaters

on Oct. 4 Any comic book movie that makes a billion dollars is going to have the sequel talk. But with "Joker" it was never a given that it would go anywhere: Joaquin Phoenix doesn't do sequels. Yet it turned out, Phoenix wasn't quite done with Arthur Fleck yet either.

During the first, the actor wondered what this character would look like in different situations. He and the on-set photographer mocked up classic movie posters, like "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest" and "Yentl" with the Joker in them and showed them to Phillips.

Explore

"Sometimes you're just done with something and other times you have an ongoing interest," Phoenix said. "There was just more to explore. ... I just felt like we weren't done."

So Phillips and his co-writer Scott Silver got to work on a new script, one that leaned into the music in Arthur Fleck's head. Then his dreary Arkham life turns to Technicolor when he meets and falls for Lee, a Joker su-

"Joaquin Phoenix is not going to do a line drive. He's not going to do something that's fan service," Phillips said. "He wanted to be as scared as he was with the first movie. So, we tried to make something that is as audacious and out there and hopefully people get

One decision that's already sparking debate is casting someone with a voice like Lady Gaga's and not using that instrument to its full power. Phillips, who was a producer on "A Star is Born," wanted someone who "brought music with them." But Lee isn't a singer.

"Singing is so second nature to me, and making music and performing on stage is so inside of me. Especially this music," Gaga said. "I worked extensively on untraining myself for this movie and throwing away as much as I could all the time to make sure I was never locking into what I do. I had to really kind of erase it all.

Phoenix, who wasn't quite sure what it would be like working with someone who has such a larger-than-life superstar persona, found Gaga to be refreshingly unpretentious and available. And as an actor, he admired her commitment to the character.

"Her power is in singing and singing a particular way," he said. "For her to sacrifice that through character, to do something that people would call a musical, but to not be performing it in the way that would sound best as a singer but to approach it from the character was a very difficult process. I was really impressed with her willingness to do that.'

In addition to writing a "waltz that falls apart" for the film, Gaga is releasing a companion album, "Harlequin" on Friday with song titles including "Oh, When the Saints," "World on a String," "If My Friends Could See Me Now" and "That's Life."

Much like Phoenix's Joker isn't Heath Ledger's or Jack Nicholson's, Gaga's Lee is not the Harley Quinn of "Birds of Prey.

"We're never going to outdo what Margot Robbie did," Phillips said. "You have to do something 180 degrees in the other direction."

Sure, Lee will still casually light something on fire to get some time alone with Joker, but the tumult is more internal. And Gaga threw herself into making Lee something new: A real person, grounded in a reality that came before her.

Ensemble

"I spent a lot of my time on developing her inner life (which) for me had a lot to do with her storm and what thing was always making her about to explode," Gaga said. "There's a particular kind of danger that she carries with her, but it's inside and it's kind of explosive.'

Brendan Gleeson didn't have much hesitation about joining the ensemble. He'd worked with Phoenix before on "The Village" and

was in awe of what he'd done on the first

"He has an absolute relentless integrity and curiosity and drive," Gleeson said. "He won't just plough the same furrow for its own sake.' But he also didn't want to play the simple version of an Arkham prison guard.

"I said, look, do you just want a brute? Because I'm not sure I just want to do a brute," Gleeson said. "He wanted something more. We tried to find layers in this guy.

Anyone who has worked with Phoenix knows that he likes to keep things fresh. That may mean something as small as changing the location of a prop or as big as throwing out choreography that you've been rehearsing for months at the last minute.

"I think we both love mayhem and not just in movies but on the set," Phillips said. "It had to feel like anything can happen.

With the crew 95% the same as the first, everyone was ready to be flexible. Gaga, too, dove right in, suggesting that they sing live on camera.

"It changed the whole making of the film," Phillips said. "We were not only singing live, we were singing live differently every take."

Curiosity

Since Arthur killed Robert De Niro's talk show host Murray Franklin on live television in the first film, he's become a kind of icon and curiosity thanks in no small part to an oft referenced, but never seen, television movie that was made about him. Now, the trial is going to be televised as well.

"Underneath it all, there's this idea of corruption and how everything is corrupt in the system, from the prison system to the judicial system to the idea of entertainment, quite frankly," Phillips said. "This idea that in the States at least, everything is entertainment. A court trial could be entertainment, and a presidential election can be entertainment. So, if that's true, what is entertainment?"

It's easier to be to the insurgent, not the incumbent, Phillips said. Although a Joker film is never going to fly completely under the radar, the spotlight is undoubtedly more intense this time around.

"You do feel like you have a larger target on your back," Phillips said.

While much of the film was made on Warner Bros. soundstages in Los Angeles, the production did go back to New York to film again on the Bronx staircase (which now come up on Google Maps as the Joker Stairs) and outside a Manhattan courthouse





RSV shot urged for seniors

It's time to roll up sleeves for new COVID, flu shots

WASHINGTON, Sept 26, (AP): Fall means it's time for just about everybody to get up to date on their flu and COVID-19 vaccines - and a lot of older adults also need protection against another risky winter virus, RSV.

Yes, you can get your flu and COV-ID-19 shots at the same time. Don't call them boosters - they're not just another dose of last year's protection. The coronavirus and influenza are escape artists that constantly mutate to evade your body's immune defenses, so both vaccines are reformulated annually to target newer strains.

"Right now is the best time" to get all the recommended fall vaccinations, said Dr. Mandy Cohen, director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, as she got her flu shot Wednesday. She has an appointment for her COVID-19 shot, too. It's "the single most effective thing you can do to protect yourself, your family, your community.'

While they're not perfect, vaccinations offer strong protection against a bad case of flu or COVID-19 - or dying

"It may not prevent every infection but those infections are going to be less severe," said CDC's Dr. Demetre Daskalakis. "I would rather have my grandmother or my great-grandmother have a sniffle than have to go to the emergency room on Thanksgiving."

The challenge: Getting more Americans to roll up their sleeves. Last year, just 45% of adults got a flu vaccination and even fewer, 23%, got a COVID-19 shot. A survey released Wednesday by the National Foundation for Infectious Diseases shows an equally low number intend to this fall.

And the coronavirus still killed more Americans than flu last year.

"Maybe we believe that it's not going to be me but let's not take a chance," said Dr. Michael Knight of George Washington University. "Why not get a vaccine that's going to help you reduce that risk?"

The CDC urges both an updated COVID-19 shot and yearly flu vaccine for everyone ages 6 months and older. If you recently had COVID-19, you can wait two or three months but still should get an updated vaccination because of the expected winter surge.

Both viruses can be especially dangerous to certain groups including older people and those with weak immune systems and lung or heart disease. Young children also are more vulnerable. The CDC counted 199 child deaths from flu last year.

Hope for new anti-AIDS drugs

Type 1 diabetes patient cured with new stem cell transplant

BEIJING, Sept 26, (Xinhua): Chinese scientists have realized the clinical cure of a type 1 diabetes patient by transplanting islet cells derived from chemically induced pluripotent stem cells (CiPSC-islets), according to clinical research published on Wednesday in the journal Cell.

This CiPSC-islets therapy aimed at curing type 1 diabetes, the first of its kind, was performed by medical scientists from Tianjin First Central Hospital, Peking University, Changping Bioscience.

Diabetes is a major disease that threatens human health -- with type 1 diabetes being one of the more severe forms. It is difficult to achieve precise blood sugar control through current treatment methods, leading to various complications that severely affect patients' quality of life.

According to Wang Shusen from Tianjin First Central Hospital, one of the corresponding authors of the paper, traditional islet transplant therapy can alleviate these problems and has shown clear progress as an alternative treatment strategy, but a shortage of pancreas donors means its application

During the study, a female patient who had type 1 diabetes for 11 years was completely dependent on insublood sugar control. After the transplant of CiPSC-islets, she regained the capability to autonomously regulate her blood sugar. Seventy-five days after the trans-

lin treatment and suffered from poor

plant, she became insulin independent and has remained insulin injectionfree for over a year. All her diabetesrelated indicators have reached the levels of a healthy person, confirming the clinical cure of this type 1 diabetes

Also:

NANJING: A Chinese research team has isolated an antibody from alpacas that can effectively inhibit HIV, providing a promising avenue for the development of new anti-AIDS drugs.

The findings were recently published in the international academic journal Nature Communications.

Antiretroviral therapy is currently the primary clinical approach to inhibiting HIV replication, according to Wu Zhiwei, professor at the School of Medicine, Nanjing University.

While this treatment effectively extends the lifespan of patients, it may lead to significant drug resistance in the virus. Therefore, there is an urgent need to explore new therapies, said Wu, who is also a co-corresponding author of the research.







Frenchman grabs 12th major trophy

Giroud, Lloris propel LAFC to victory over Sporting in US Open Cup final

LOS ANGELES, Sept 26, (AP): Olivier Giroud and Hugo Lloris reached the pinnacle of soccer's mountaintop by helping France win the 2018 World Cup.

On Wednesday night, they said they celebrated just the same after helping Los Angeles Football Club take home the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup with a 3-1 victory over Sporting Kansas City in extra time.

Giroud and Lloris were just as surprised to be feeling the same emotion, but adding another trophy can

"It is different when you have to play in a final. You just go for it. I'm really proud of the team," said Giroud, who opened the scoring in the second half.

It is the 12th major trophy for Giroud, who turns 38 on Monday. Lloris joined LAFC this year, becoming the first World Cup winner to play

for the club.

Omar Campos and Kei Kamara scored in extra time to give LAFC its fourth trophy since starting play in 2018. The club captured Major League Soccer's Supporters Shield as the top club in the regular season in 2019 and '22, and beat the Philadelphia Union on penalty kicks to win the MLS Cup in 2022.

RIYADH, Sept 26: The highly anticipated clash between Egyptian football giants Al-Ahly and Zamalek will take place today at King Abdullah Sports City Stadium in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. This showdown marks another chapter in the dominance of Egyptian and Arab clubs in the African Super Cup since the competition's inception in 1993.

The African Super Cup is contested in a single match between the winners of the African Champions League and the African Cup Winners' Cup, which was later merged with the Confederation Cup under its current name. Egyptian clubs have a stronghold

on the African Super Cup, with 12 victories - Al-Ahly leading with 8 titles and Zamalek with 4. Al-Ahly has been runners-up on three occasions: losing to Zamalek in 1994 and to ES Sétif (2015) and USM Alger (2023) of Algeria, while Zamalek has only lost once, in 2001, to Ghana's Hearts of Oak.

Beyond Al-Ahly and Zamalek, 15 other teams have won the African Super Cup. TP Mazembe of the Democratic Republic of the Congo leads this group with 3 titles, while Etoile du Sahel (Tunisia), Raja Casablanca (Morocco), and Enyimba (Nigeria) have each won twice. Other winners include Espérance de Tunis, Wydad Casablanca, and Africa Sports, the inaugural winner in 1993, along with Hearts of Oak, Renaissance Berkane, Maghreb de Fès, ES Sétif, USM Alger, Mamelodi Sundowns, Orlando Pirates, and ASEC Mimosas.

On the other side, 9 clubs have narrowly missed winning the title, including CS Sfaxien (Tunisia), Motema Pembe (DR Congo), JS Kabylie (Algeria), and Egypt's El Mokawloon. Others such as Fath Rabat, Royal Army (Morocco), Kaizer Chiefs (South Africa), Stade Malien, and Congo's Leop-

GALLE, Sri Lanka, Sept 26, (AP): Dinesh Chandimal's 16th century helped Sri Lanka dominate a careless New Zealand by 306-3 to begin the second test on Thursday at their Galle fortress.

Chandimal was supported well by Angelo Mathews, 78 not out, Kamindu Mendis, 51 not out, and Dimuth Karunaratne's 46.

Sri Lanka and England share the record for the most test wins at a single venue, 25, at Galle and Lord's respectively. And Sri Lanka has made a great start to surpassing England's tally. Chandimal and Karunaratne com-

bined for 122 for the second wicket until a mix up saw Karunaratne run out. He hit to square leg and attempted a quick single after a misfield but was sent back by Chandimal and didn't make it.

Chandimal remained composed, going on to score his first test hundred against New Zealand and his sixth in Galle. Only Kumar Sangakkara and Mahela Jayawardene, with seven centuries each, have scored more at the iconic ground. Chandimal and Mathews added 97

runs for the third wicket before Glenn Phillips broke through. Chandimal, who had been using his footwork expertly against spin, misjudged the off-spinner and was bowled while attempting another aggressive shot. His 116 came off 208 balls, featuring 15 boundaries. The in-form Mendis joined Mathews

and began to score with ease. Mendis finished the day unbeaten on 51 from 56 balls, laced with eight boundaries and one towering six. In the past month, Mendis has three fifties and a first-test century. Mathews, solid as ever, ended the

day on 78 not out from 166 deliveries, with six boundaries. He passed 2,000 test runs in Galle.
