Kuwait, Indonesia finalize labor deal

KUWAIT CITY, Dec 21: Indonesian Ambassador to Kuwait Lena Maryana has announced that a memorandum of understanding (MoU) between Indonesia and Kuwait focusing on the recruitment of skilled workers, particularly in the health sector, has been finalized and will be signed soon.

In a statement at the embassy's annual 'Winter Market' festival on Saturday, Maryana disclosed that Indonesia is home to many highly skilled and competent workers. She affirmed efforts to strengthen ties between Indonesia and Kuwait, especially at the end of the CO-VID-19 pandemic.

She said there has been a significant increase in the Indonesian community in Kuwait; with the number rising to 7,000 this year, up from 6,000 last year. "Majority of these individuals work in the hospitality and health sectors," she added.

She also revealed that Indonesia is currently exporting various products to Kuwait like vaccines, food and electronics; which are gaining traction in Kuwaiti markets. She pointed out that these are promising areas of cooperation, particularly in the field of food security.

Furthermore, she confirmed that discussions are ongoing to resume direct daily flights between Jakarta and Kuwait, operated by Kuwait Airways, after their suspension in 2015.

Regarding the festival, she stated that the embassy holds the 'Winter Market' annually to bring together members of the Indonesian community in Kuwait. "The event, which also attracts heads of diplomatic missions and many Kuwaiti friends, features traditional Indonesian folk dances and a showcase of renowned Indonesian dishes, some of which have been recognized by UNESCO as part of the country's cultural heritage," she added.

Kuwait welcomes Kuwait issues strong condemnation **UNGA** resolution

KUWAIT CITY, Dec 21, (KUNA): The Kuwaiti Foreign Ministry on Saturday welcomed the UN General Assembly resolution requesting a legal opinion from the International Court of Justice (ICJ) about the unprovoked ban on the activities of UN refugee agency, UNRWA.

In a press release, the ministry underlined that this resolution is a significant step that reflects international solidarity with the Palestinian people, and categorical opposition to Israeli measures undermining the UNRWA's role and distorting its humanitarian message.

It reiterated Kuwait's unwavering support for the UNRWA as a core pillar for helping Palestinian refugees, while restating its steadfast and principled stance on the Palestinian cause as well as support for the Palestinian people to end the occupation and establish an independent state on the June 4, 1967 border, with East Jerusalem as its capital.



'Kuwait Vision 2035', new infrastructure projects lauded

KUWAIT CITY, Dec 21, (KUNA): Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Saturday that trade and commerce have been important pillars of bilateral relationship between Kuwait and India, with two-way trade increasing.

"Trade and commerce have been important pillars of our bilateral relationship. Our bilateral trade has been on an upswing. Our energy partnership adds a unique value to our bilateral trade," the Indian prime minister said in an interview to KUNA.

The Indian prime minister arrived in Kuwait on Saturday in the first visit by an Indian prime minister to Kuwait in over four decades

"We are happy to see 'Made in India' products, particularly in automobile, electrical and mechanical machinery, and telecom segments making new inroads in Kuwait. India today is interest in investing in India now, adding that bilaterally and multilaterally, there has been a good understanding of each other's interests.

Modi boasted that his country is currently amongst the fastest-growing large economies in the world, as in less than a decade it has moved from being the 11th largest to the 5th largest economy in the world, and is poised to become the 3rd largest economy soon.

He believed that this growth creates immense opportunities for investment across a variety of sectors and that the pace of infrastructure development in Îndia is extraordinary, be it expressways, railways, airports, ports, energy grids or digital connectivity. "Over the last decade, we have dou-

bled our airports from 70 in 2014 to over 150 in 2024. In the next five years, 31 Indian cities will be serviced by metro transport systems. The number of education and skill development institutions has also doubled since 2014, reflecting a strong focus on human capital development. This is supported by a favorable demography and a highly skilled workforce," he said.

"Digital economy and services are raising productivity, ushering efficiency and creating new consumer demand. Almost fifty percent of all global digital payments are happening in India.

are in the pipeline." However, he said there is a lot of synergy in both sides' visions which align on many fronts as the tremendous pace of economic activity in both countries open up large opportunities for the two governments and companies to cooperate and collaborate.

He pointed out that Kuwait and India have a much wider partnership in a large number of areas, apart from the traditional energy sector partnership, including education, skilling, technology, and defense cooperation.

"A number of Indian companies are already engaged in execution of infrastructure projects in various sectors in Kuwait. Similarly, we are seeing investments from Kuwaiti companies in India. It is a mutually beneficial partnership in a true sense," he said.

Responding to a question about how India's soft power can influence its global outreach, he said India's civilizational ethos and heritage form the foundation of its soft power that its soft power has grown significantly alongside its expanding global presence, particularly over the last decade.

"In Kuwait and the Gulf, Indian movies stand out as a prime example of this cultural connection. We have seen that people in Kuwait have a special liking for Indian cinema. I am told that

A DIGEST OF PUBLIC OPINION

When nepotism eats away at nation's body!

"I ONCE believed that a culture of rejecting nepotism could start within families, spreading to schools, and eventually to workplaces, gradually expanding through society. However, I was reminded of a prevailing cultural belief," columnist Youssef Abdul Karim Al-Zankawi wrote for Al-Jarida daily.

"If my eyes love you, time will not harm you.' This mindset has led to the spread of social hypocrisy, which eventually manifested in administrative and professional hypocrisy, where people go to great lengths to please those in power, often at any cost.

"Over time, another proverb emerged: "Whoever hunts it will ruin his children," reinforcing the idea of "mukhamat" -- a concept which, in

simple terms, refers to looting or plundering.

"This principle, rooted in our behavior, suggests that what one acquires through mukhamat is essentially the property of someone else. "As a result, nepotism, likened

to this looting mentality, has taken hold of our administrative and economic systems. "When certain laws include

provisions allowing ministers to exempt cases from stipulated condi-

tions, such clauses are often the starting point for the spread of nepotism in both the public and financial sectors

"If you examine every corruption case that has made headlines, you'll discover that nepotism is often the root cause. It is evident that all our administrative, financial, and social issues -- along with our broader culture -stem from this epidemic.

"Without nepotism, we wouldn't have seen parachute appointments, nor would we have witnessed the seizing of lands, barns, and chalets.

"We wouldn't have had violations regarding government housing, exceptional pensions, forgery, duplication, and other corrupt practices that have flourished in our society, all because of nepotism.

"Personally, I despise nepotism because it undermines the law and devalues the principles of justice and equality.

'Nepotism elevates the ego of those who seek it, making them feel superior to others and giving them a false sense of entitlement to take what doesn't belong to them. Ironically, those who seek nepotism are often the same individuals who demand strict enforcement of laws for others who break them.

"During my time working in banking and as a daily columnist, I met several high-ranking officials, including the late Lieutenant General Mutafad Abdul Hamid Haji Abdul Rahim, Lieutenant General Mustafa Al-Zaabi, Lieutenant General Abdullah Muhanna, and Lieutenant General Thabet Muhanna.

"Despite this, I never asked any of them to assist me in securing special treatment or achieving personal gain. Instead, I would have asked them to expel me from their offices had I requested anything that went against the

law. "I also provided media-related services to the General Traffic Department, which was known to Lieutenant General Abdullah Muhanna, helping to revise and shorten road sign messages in Arabic and English to better serve my country.

"It seems that the rejection of nepotism has been passed down to my children. One of them, a doctor, refuses to accept nepotism even when it comes to assisting his own father. More than nine years ago, "I went to the nuclear medicine department at Mubarak Hospital to schedule a stress test as part of a heart examination.

"The receptionist told me the earliest appointment was in five months, to which I agreed. However, when she saw my name, she asked if I was related to Dr. soand-so.

"Upon confirming that he was my son, she suggested that he should intervene to bring the appointment forward. I responded that he would never break the law to favor me over other patients. I asked her to schedule the appointment as initially offered.

"Suddenly, my son appeared behind me and politely told the receptionist, "Please, do what my father says, even if it means waiting more than five months for the appointment.'

Also:

"The Arabic language is increasingly facing challenges in the field of scientific and academic research, particularly with the growing reliance on foreign journals and publishing in English at academic institutions in Kuwait, such as Kuwait University and the Public Authority for Applied Education and Training," Dalal Anwar Al-Sharhan wrote for Al-Anba daily.

"As researchers are increasingly encouraged to publish in prestigious foreign journals as a standard of academic excellence, publishing in Arabic and Arabic scientific journals is becoming marginalized. This raises critical questions about the status of the Arabic language in science and its role in enriching the academic community

"While there is no doubt that English has become the global language of science and an effective tool for reaching a wider audience and promoting knowledge exchange, the overemphasis on publishing in English at the expense of Arabic risks marginalizing the cultural and scientific identity of Arab researchers.

"It also leads to a reduction in the scientific content available in Arabic. This brings forth an important question: Is abandoning publishing in Arabic the best solution to enhance research quality in the Arab world?

"The Arabic language is not just a tool for communication; it is a vessel for the cultural and civilizational identity of the Arab world.

"Taking pride in the Arabic language and enriching it with modern scientific terms and concepts strengthens its status and ensures its continued relevance in the face of scientific developments.

"Promoting scientific research in Arabic should, therefore, be seen as both a moral and cultural responsibility, not just an academic choice.

"Societies that neglect their mother tongue in scientific research risk losing a part of their identity, reducing science and knowledge to a domain reserved for a group of elites fluent in foreign languages.

"While some Arab scientific journals may have lower quality compared to global counterparts, abandoning them is not the solution.



Three separate requests by investigation team dodged

South Korean investigators seek to quiz reluctant president

SEOUL, Dec 21, (AP): South Korean investigators again sought to question impeached President Yoon Suk Yeol over his Dec. 3 declaration of martial law, summoning him for questioning on Christmas Day despite his repeated refusal to cooperate.

The Corruption Investigation Office for High-Ranking Officials, which is leading a joint investigation with police and military authorities into the illconceived power grab that lasted only a few hours, said it plans to question Yoon on charges of abuse of authority and orchestrating a rebellion.

Yoon, whose presidential powers have been suspended since the opposition-controlled National Assembly impeached him on Dec. 14, has so far dodged three separate requests by the joint investigation team and public prosecutors to appear for questioning while also blocking searches of his office.

It's not clear what investigators can do if Yoon continues to reject their demands. Under the country's laws, locations potentially linked to military secrets cannot be seized or searched without the consent of the person in charge, and it's unlikely that Yoon will voluntarily leave his residence if he faces of being compelled to appear.

Yoon is focusing on defending himself at the Constitutional Court, which following his impeachment will decide whether to remove him from office or reinstate his powers.

Yoon's martial law decree and parliamentary impeachment have triggered a political storm, disrupting state affairs, halting high-level diplomacy and sending shockwaves through financial markets at a time when the country was already grappling with a faltering economy.

The country's acting leader, Prime Minister Han Duck-soo, and other officials have tried to reassure allies and diplomatic partners that things are returning to normal, but tensions between rival political parties are only escalating as they clash over government policies and the appointments of new justices to the Constitutional

The joint investigation team also on Friday obtained a court warrant to formally arrest Maj. Gen. Moon Sangho, commander of the Defense Intelligence Command, who was detained this week over suspicions that he sent troops to the National Election Commission in Gwacheon city after Yoon declared martial law.

Yoon defended his decision for troops to be deployed at the election commission as other forces were encircling the National Assembly. He claimed the troop deployment was necessary in order to investigate supposed vulnerabilities to the commission's computer systems potentially affecting credibility of election results.

Yoon's failure to offer any evidence in support of his claims raised concerns that he was endorsing conspiracy theories from right-wing YouTube channels that April's parliamentary elections were rigged.

Germans mourn Christmas market attack

MAGDEBURG, Germany, Dec 21, (AP): Germans on Saturday mourned both the victims and their shaken sense of security after a Saudi doctor intentionally drove into a Christmas market teeming with holiday shoppers, killing at least five people, including a small child, and wounding at least 200 others.

Authorities arrested a 50-year-old man at the site of the attack in Magdeburg on Friday evening and took him into custody for questioning. He has lived in Germany since 2006, practicing medicine in Bernburg, about 40 kilometers (25 miles) south of Magdeburg. officials said.

The state governor, Reiner Haseloff, told reporters

the victims.

There were still no answers Saturday as to what motivated the man to drive his black BMW into a crowd in the eastern German city.

Describing himself as a former Muslim, the suspect shared dozens of tweets and retweets daily focusing on anti-Islam themes, criticizing the religion and congratulating Muslims who left the faith.

He also accused German authorities of failing to do enough to combat what he said was the "Islamism of Europe." Some described him as an activist who helped Saudi women flee their homeland. He has also voiced support for the far-right and anti-immigrant Alternative for Germany (AfD) party. Haseloff said Friday that authorities believed the man acted alone. The violence shocked Germany and the city, bringing its mayor to the verge of tears and marring a festive event that's part of a centuries-old German tradition. It prompted several other German towns to cancel their weekend Christmas markets as a precaution and out of solidarity with Magdeburg's loss. Berlin kept its markets open but has increased its police presence at them. Germany has suffered a string of extremist attacks in recent years, including a knife attack that killed three people and wounded eight at a festival in the western city of Solingen in August.

Debt ceiling debate pushed to 2025

Government funding bill clears Congress, averting a shutdown

WASHINGTON, Dec 21, (AP): Facing a government shutdown deadline, the Senate rushed through final passage early Saturday of a bipartisan plan that would temporarily fund federal operations and disaster aid, dropping President-elect Donald Trump's demands for a debt limit increase into the new year.

House Speaker Mike Johnson had insisted Congress would "meet our obligations" and not allow federal operations to shutter ahead of the Christmas holiday season. But the day's outcome was uncertain after Trump doubled down on his insistence that a debt ceiling increase be included in any deal - if not, he said in an early morning post, let the closures "start now."

The House approved Johnson's new bill overwhelmingly, 366-34. The Senate worked into the night to pass it, 85-11, just after the deadline. At midnight, the White House said it had ceased shutdown preparations.

"This is a good outcome for the country," Johnson said after the House vote, adding he had spoken with Trump and the president-elect "was certainly happy about this outcome, as well."

President Joe Biden, who has played a less public role in the process throughout a turbulent week, was expected to sign the measure into law Saturday "There will be no government shut-

LONDON, Dec 21, (AP): It's a photo that sent a tremor through British politics: Elon Musk flanked by British politician Nigel Farage and a wealthy backer, in front of a gilt-framed paint-ing of a young Donald Trump.

Taken this week at Trump's Mar-a-Lago estate in Florida, the image suggested that Musk, a key player in the incoming U.S. administration, could soon turn his disruptive attention to the U.K.

Farage, Trump's highest-profile British champion, confirmed talks are underway about Musk making a hefty donation to Farage's party Reform U.K. The Times of London reported it could be as much as \$100 million, which would be far and away the largest political donation in U.K. history. The reports have sparked calls for Britain's rules on political donations to be tightened - quickly.

"We did discuss money," Farage told broadcaster GB News after the meeting with Musk. "That's a negotiation we will go back and have again. He is not against giving us money. He hasn't fully decided whether he will.'

Britain has strict limits on how much political parties can spend on elections, but they can accept unlimited donations, as long as the donors are U.K. voters or companies registered in Britain. Musk's social network X has a British arm, Twitter U.K. Ltd., with a registered address in London.

Critics say that is a loophole that allows foreign influence in U.K. politics. The voting watchdog, the Electoral Commission, is calling for changes including limiting the amount a company can donate, so that it can't put in more money than it earns in Britain.

"It's crucial that U.K. voters have trust in the financing of our political system," the commission's chief

executive Vijay Rangarajan told The Guardian. "The system needs strengthening, and we have been calling for changes to the law since 2013, to protect the electoral system from foreign interference.'

Britain's center-left Labour Party pledged during the summer election campaign to tighten the rules on political donations, though legislation is not scheduled in the coming year. Prime Minister Keir Starmer's spokesman Dave Pares said Wednesday that work is already underway to "reinforce existing safeguards" against "impermissible proxy donations.'

Both the Labour government and the right-of-center opposition Conservatives are trying to figure out how to deal with Musk, who has taken a keen interest in the U.K. - and seemingly formed a strong dislike for Starmer.

Crowds in Mayotte vented their frustration at French President Emmanuel Macron, with some booing, as he toured destruction wrought by the strongest cyclone to hit the French territory in nearly a century.

Particularly tense scenes on Thursday underscored the discontent that many residents of the archipelago in the Indian Ocean feel toward their government, based about 8,000 kilometers (5,000 miles) away in Paris.

The people of Mayotte, the poorest department in France, have previously said they suffer from underinvestment and neglect by the government. Now, they are expressing disappointment with the response to Cyclone Chido, which hit Saturday.

The storm has devastated entire neighborhoods and caused an unknown number of deaths, as many people ignored warnings, thinking the

storm wouldn't be so extreme. Authorities have said hundreds or possibly thousands may be dead, but the official toll rose to 35 on Friday

In the morning, Macron visited a neighborhood in Tsingoni on Mayotte's main island, where people remain without access to drinking water or phone service nearly a week after the storm

As he walked through the area, some shouted: "We want water, we want water." Others, however, offered him a warmer welcome, posing for selfies with the French leader and showing him their children.

But the night before, Macron was met with boos from dozens of residents in Pamandzi on another nearby island.

As people expressed frustration at the slow pace of aid efforts, Macron grabbed a microphone and became angry

Moving towards the crowd, he said: "I have nothing to do with the cyclone, you can blame me, it wasn't me!"

Macron, who is known for his appetite for debate and for confronting people who are angry at him, vacillated between acknowledging the hardship and pushing back against criticism.

Philippine president's approval, trust ratings dip

MANILA, Dec 21, (Agencies): The approval and trust ratings of Philippine President Ferdinand Romualdez Marcos and Vice President Sara Duterte dropped in November, according to the latest national survey released Saturday.

An independent survey by Pulse Asia Inc., conducted from Nov. 26 to Dec. 3 this year with 2,400 people aged 18 and above, found that 48 percent of the respondents approved of Marcos' performance, down from the 50 rating he earned in the September survey. Marcos' trust rating also dipped to 47 percent in November from 50 in September.

Duterte's approval rating was 50 percent in November, lower than the 60 percent rating she received in September. Her trust rating fell to 49 percent from 61 in September.

Meanwhile, China urged the Philippines on Friday to immediately halt "provocative acts" on the heels of a Philippine aircraft's breach of the air space over the island of Huangyan in the South China Sea.

Spokesperson of the Chinese Coast Guards, Liu Dejun, said in a statement that the C-208 plane "illegally ventured" into the island airspace, and that the Chinese Coast Guards closely monitored its movements in the skies.

This island is a Chinese territory since a long time ago, he said, accusing Manila of violating China's sovereignty, warning that such an incident may lead to unpredictable developments

Jitters have been high between the two regional nations over rights in the South China Sea.

Burgan Bank receives CBK's 'approval' to acquire 100% stake in Bahrain's UGB

Transaction expected to be completed by Q1'25

KUWAIT CITY, Dec 21: Burgan Bank announced that it has obtained the final approval from the Central Bank of Kuwait (CBK) to acquire 100% stake in United Gulf Bank (UGB), a licensed conventional wholesale bank headquartered in Bahrain. The execution of this transaction remains subject to closing formalities that are expected to be completed by the first quarter of 2025 (Q1'25).

The purchase price of this transaction has been settled at USD 190 million, which roughly translates to 1.0x of UGB's current shareholders' equity or book value. This acquisition is expected to

have an impact of 60 to 70 basis points on Burgan Bank's regulatory capital ratios, predominantly due to the consolidation of UGB's assets. The final impact would be determined at the closing of shares' transfer. It is worth mentioning that UGB has a 60% stake in Kamco Investment Company (Kamco Invest).

Mr. Tony Daher, Group Chief Executive Officer at Burgan Bank, said: "The 100% acquisition of UGB aligns with the Bank's new asset reallocation strategy and efforts to build newand diversified revenue streams. This transactionwould benefit Burgan by provid-ing access to KAMCO Invest's platform to further drive its noninterest income. Additionally, it will help expand the Bank's footprint across the GCC region while contributing to bolstering potential revenues and synergies through UGB's banking license.'

Mr. Daher emphasized that the Bank's ongoing efforts to achieve sustainable growth and implement expansion plans are guided mainly by its vision to become the most modern and progressive bank in Kuwait. This vision is driven by a focus on key strategic pillars, including asset reallocation, embracing digital transformation, investing in human capital development, and adhering to environmental, social, and governance (ESG) standards in order to deliver an outstanding banking experience that lives up to customers' aspirations and meets their needs.

It serves to note thatin June 2024, Burgan Bank announced that it had received CBK's initial approval to engage with Bahrain's regulatory authorities regarding the acquisition of a100% stake in UGB. Shortly thereafter, the Bank secured a no-objection from the Central Bank of Bahrain in August 2024, followed by final approval from CBK. The transaction is expected to be finalized during the first three months of 2025.

Other Voices US: Europe, buy more gas or else ...

A SIMPLE but clear message is coming from the new U.S. administration that is set to take power soon: Europe must buy more American gas, or face the threat of increased tariffs on European goods and ser-

vices. This is happening despite Europe being the largest buyer of U.S. oil and gas, with even greater opportunities emerging after the European Al-Harami

Union's boycott of Russian energy. However, the U.S. is pushing for even more, even though it cannot significantly increase crude production at the moment and is dealing with its own tight supply issues in the gas market.

The EU is desperate to avoid a trade war and the imposition of tariffs, which would be devastating, especially considering the U.S. is the world's biggest economic force. There is no doubt that the coming U.S. administration is playing tough with its closest ally.

The EU has no choice but to

the largest supplier of LNG and oil to the European Union, providing about 49 percent of total European imports in the first half of this year, and 16 percent from Russia, the pressure is mounting. In the third quarter of this year, the U.S. supplied around 20 percent of the EU's oil.

EU officials are deeply concerned and are scrambling to import more of their gas and oil needs, with the reduction in Russian supplies, which will likely be further reduced. The U.S. gas supply is currently tight and difficult to increase, but it is expected to rise in the future. Meanwhile, oil supply from the U.S. is poised to increase, with the country set to deliver an additional 15 to 20 million barrels to Europe within the next five years.

This is a concerning figure that should set the alarm for all oil-producing nations and OPEC in the coming years.

Once again, the threat of imposing up to a 20 percent tariff on all non-Chinese U.S. imports is a major concern for the European Union. The EU must exert efforts to increase its imports from the U.S., including agricultural products, to satisfy the new U.S. administration and maintain its strongest ally.

The European Union must prepare for the upcoming U.S. admination as there i no room fo compromise if it hopes to avoid high tariffs. The EU is ready to take all necessary measures to navigate this challenge. Email: naftikuwaiti@yahoo.com

Fed's preferred inflation gauge shows **US price pressures eased last month**

Report shows prices rose just 0.1% from Oct to Nov

WASHINGTON, Dec 21, (AP): An inflation gauge that is closely watched by the Federal Reserve barely rose last month in a sign that price pressures cooled after two months of sharp gains.

Friday's report from the Commerce Department showed that prices rose just 0.1% from October to November. Excluding the volatile food and energy categories, prices also ticked up just 0.1%, after two months of outsize 0.3% gains.

The milder inflation figures arrive two days after Federal Reserve officials, led by Chair Jerome Powell, rocked financial markets by revealing that they now expect to cut their key interest rate just two times in 2025, down from four in their previous estimate. Stickier inflation, Powell said, "might be the single biggest factor" causing the central bank to reduce the number of rate cuts it envisions. Fewer Fed rate cuts would likely mean that mortgage rates and other consumer borrowing costs would remain elevated

Friday's data did contain one sign of still-persistent inflation: Year-over-year inflation edged up to 2.4% in November from 2.3% in October and above the Fed's 2% inflation target. But year-over-year "core" prices, which exclude volatile food and energy costs, were unchanged at 2.8%. The Fed pays closer attention to the core figures, which are regarded as a better sign of where inflation is likely headed.

The modest monthly inflation figures in Friday's report point to one likely reason why the Fed was willing to cut its benchmark interest rate Wednesday: Its preferred inflation gauge, known as the personal consumption expenditures price index, is coming in lower - and closer to the Fed's target - than the higher-profile consumer price index. The core CPI, for example, was 3.3% in November.

Friday's report also showed that consumers increased their spending by a solid 0.4% from October to November, a sign that households continue to propel the economy. On Thursday, the government reported that the U.S. economy grew at a healthy 3.1% annual rate last quarter, largely thanks to consumer demand. "We can break for the holidays with the comfort that the economy's growth engine is humming along," Oren Klachkin, an economist at Nationwide Financial, wrote in a client note. "The Fed would like to continue lowering interest rates, but it feels it can't do so amid what increasingly looks like an elevated inflation and resilient growth environment.

Incomes also rose 0.3% last month, faster than prices - a trend which, if it continues over time, should help Americans adjust to higher costs.

Powell had said Wednesday that even if Friday's inflation figures came in unusually low, it would have only a limited effect on the Fed's outlook.

"Our position shouldn't change based on two or three points of good or bad data," he said at a news conference. "We have a long string now of inflation coming down gradually over time. ... We still have some work to do."

Inflation, according to the measure released Friday - the personal consumption expenditures price index - has plummeted from a peak of 7.2% in June 2022 to 2.1% in September. The Fed's tool for fighting inflation is to steadily raise borrowing costs across the economy, which tends to cool spending and growth.

10 Kuwaitis graduate from Germany's RENAC

BERLIN, Dec 21, (KUNA): New 10 Kuwaiti trainees have graduated from Germany's renewable energy academy (RENAC), as part of its program of developing photoelectric cell systems.

The Berlin-based academy held a graduation ceremony, which featured Kuwait's Ambassador to Germany Reem Al-Khaled and head of the academy Berthold Breid.

Speaking to KUNA in a statement on Saturday, Al-Khaled said she is proud of Kuwaiti trainees who took part in this session, which came as part of collaboration between the RENAC and Kuwait's Ministry of Electricity & Water & Renewable Energy.

She congratulated Kuwaitis on this progress, and stressed the initiative constituted a key step toward achieving Kuwait's ambitious vision regarding enhancing innovation and sustainability in energy.

Lending to companies had tightened more than expected

Russia's cbank holds off on interest rate hike amid friction between inflation, war spending

MOSCOW, Dec 21, (AP): Russia's central bank has left its benchmark interest rate at a record 21%, holding off on further increases despite high consumer inflation fueled by the Kremlin's war against Ukraine

The decision Friday comes amid criticism from influential business figures, including tycoons close to the Kremlin, that high rates are putting the brakes on business activity and the economy

And it underlines the ongoing friction in the economy between military spending and stable prices for consumers

Central Bank of Russia Gov. Elvira Nabiullina said that lending to companies had tightened more than expected due to the October rate hike that brought the benchmark to its current record level. The central bank held open the possibility of an increase at its next meeting and said inflation was expected to fall to an annual 4% next year from its current 9.5%

Factories are running three shifts making every-

thing from vehicles to clothing for the military, while a labor shortage is driving up wages and fat enlistment bonuses are putting more rubles in people's bank accounts to spend. All that is driving up prices.

On top of that, the weakening Russian ruble raises the prices of imported goods like cars and consumer electronics from China, which has become Russia's biggest trade partner since Western sanctions disrupted economic relations with Europe and the U.S.

Russia's military spending is enabled by oil exports, which have shifted from Europe to new customers in India and China who aren't observing sanctions such as a \$60 per barrel price cap on Russian oil sales.

High interest rates can dampen inflation but also make it more expensive for businesses to get the credit they need to operate and invest.

Critics of the central bank rates and of Nabiullina have included Sergei Chemezov, the head of statecontrolled defense and technology conglomerate Rostec, and steel magnate Alexei Mordashov.

Russian President Vladimir Putin opened his annual news conference on Thursday by saying the economy is on track to grow by nearly 4% this year and that while inflation is "an alarming sign," wages have risen at the same rate and that "on the whole, this situation is stable and secure.

Putin acknowledged there had been criticism of the central bank, saying that "some experts believe that the Central Bank could have been more effective and could have started using certain instruments earlier." Asked what decision the Central Bank was going to make on the rate, Putin said that Nabiullina didn't tell him what the rate will be. "She may not know it herself yet as they discuss it during the board meeting and make the final decision during discussion," he said. "I hope that the decision will be wellbalanced and conform to today's needs.'

GCCSC projects 3.7% GDP growth by 2024

MUSCAT, Dec 21, (KUNA): The GCC Statistical Center (GCCSC) expected on Saturday a 3.7 percent GDP growth, with constant prices, in member states by 2024.

In its report, the GCCSC revealed a higher pace of continued growth in 2025 reaching 4.5 percent and 3.5 percent in 2026.

This forecast growth in 2024, 2025 and 2026 would happen due to a rise in GCC member states' oil production, the report stated.

The accelerated pace of economic recovery in the sectors related to tourism, transportation and infrastructure projects was one of

the reasons behind growth in GCC states, it noted.

GCC states' non-oil sector is expected to grow by 4.5 percent by 2024, and 7.8 and 8.6 percent in 2025 and 2026 respectively, it added.

GCC states' GDP (with constant prices) reached about USD 1.7 trillion in 2023, a five-percent growth compared with 2022, it said.

Inflation rates in GCC states are projected to reach 2.4, 2.6 and 2.1 percent from 2024 to 2026.

GCC states' consumer price index (inflation) hit 2.2 percent in 2023, a drop of .09 percent com-pared with 2022, it pointed out.



'I've always been a monkey'

In 'Better Man,' Williams faces dark side of fame

NEW YORK, Dec 21, (AP): It was after one particularly emotional premiere of the new biopic about his life that Robbie Williams resolved he couldn't be "the crying

guy" at every screening. "Better Man," which chronicles the life of Williams, the British pop star and former Take That singer, can hit him differently at different times. Jet lag is a factor. So is who's in the building. One screening with his band, he says, was "healing." But he's self-conscious enough about all the emotion that he can be defensive about

"In real life I don't cry that much," Williams says and then smiles. "You have a (expletive) biography about you and have the world go, 'I've seen you and heard you' and come tell me how you deal with it.'

One twist? The Williams heard in "Better Man" is Williams, himself. But the Williams seen in the movie is a computer-generated chimpanzee. Michael Gracey, who directed the 2017 musical hit "The Greatest Showman," had the novel idea that Williams should get the big-screen biopic treatment, but with a monkey. Relying on Weta's motion capture technology, the actor Jonno Davies stands in for Williams.

In "Better Man," which will open in limited theaters Dec. 25 and expand nationwide Jan. 10, that makes for a compelling spin on the music biopic, partly be-cause it's still a quite R-rated journey through the ups and downs of mega pop stardom.

Williams, who met a reporter last month on a stopover in New York, also hopes it will expand his footprint in America, where he's famously less famous than he is in Europe.

"If I want to phone Macron, I phone Macron. If I want to phone

the other side and you're talking about something in the past. Everybody loves a story of redemp-tion. The redemption is: I was this guy who experienced this thing but I've endured and overcome it. You throw in a word like "endure," and I can already hear British people going "(Expletive) you! What did you endure? Knickers being thrown at you." Dude, I was mentally ill. I still am, but I'm in a good place. I couldn't derive joy from anything because I was mentally ill. I won a sprinting race with two broken legs.

AP: It was that bad?

Williams: Yeah. My story's not unusual. There's a boy band documentary that's going to be on tele in Britain that I've taken part in, and everyone's story is the same. They've got the bends. They experienced this thing that warped them and gave them mental breakdowns.

I can't apologize for the truth, and the truth is there's something about this matrix-bending, washing-machine fame that's deeply unhealthy. No matter what job you have or what path you choose in life, you spend the second 20 years of your life sorting out the first 20 years. It just so happens I did it in public and told people exactly what was going as it was going on. And still do.

AP: When One Direction singer Liam Payne died, you seemed to understand what he might have been going through.

Williams: Here's the thing: I'm always astonished - may he rest in peace, bless him, beautiful boy - that the entertainment industry isn't littered with those types of cases, that we can't point to 30 of them.

AP: Fame, as you describe it, would seem clearly unhealthy. But does some part of you need it?

Williams: It's different now.

From prison to tradition: The story behind Australia's 'Gravy Day'

How Kelly's song became an Aussie tradition

NEW YORK, Dec 21, (AP): To many Australians, Saturday is more than just Dec. 21. It's "Gravy Day," all because of a lyric in one of the most unlikely Christmas songs ever written.

"How to Make Gravy," written by singer **Paul Kelly**, has become a holiday classic in Australia over the past few decades. It was cited this week by the nation's prime minister, Anthony Albanese, as he announced a decision to release five drug smugglers from prison, and is the subject of a new movie that creates a story behind the song.

"It has become our most-loved Christmas song," Jeff Jenkins, of the Australian publication The Music, wrote this week.

The story is set in a prison, the lyrics coming from a letter an inmate writes to his brother to pass along a recipe for the family's Christmas dinner. The song is about much more, though, as "Joe" expresses regret, longing, fear, paranoia, some humor and the nearuniversal holiday emotion of someone who wishes to be somewhere else. The prisoner is writing, as the song says in its second line, on the 21st of December, "and now they're ringing the last bells."

Kelly wrote "How to Make Gravy" in 1996 after being asked to contribute to a holiday album being put together for charity. He wanted to record a cover of the Band's "Christmas Must Be Tonight," but someone else had already claimed it. So Kelly tried putting words to a melody he had kicking around.

Inspiration came from one of his favorite holi-day albums, "A Christmas Gift for You from Phil Spector," and Darlene Love's recording of the clas-sic "White Christmas." Love includes writer Irving Berlin's often-bypassed first verse, where the singer talks of being in Los Angeles while wishing to be somewhere snowy and cold. "There's a clue," Kelly said in a TED talk explain-

ing the song's origins, and off he went.

In the song, "Joe" imagines the family gathering without him. "Who's going to make the gravy now?" he said. "I bet it won't taste the same." He passes along a recipe, one Kelly got in real life from a former father-in-law.

The narrator asks his brother to kiss the sleeping children, and to "give my love to Angus, and to Frank and Dolly. Tell 'em all I'm sorry I screwed up this time."

He gossips about Mary and her new boyfriend. "Do you remember the last one? What was his name again? What was his problem? He never did get Nina Simone." In performance, Kelly has occasionally replaced Simone with Joey Ramone or "a little too much cologne."

Imagination

He asks Dan to look after his wife Rita, and pictures the dancing after dinner. "Just don't hold her too close, oh brother please don't stab me in the back," he sings, quickly catching himself to note the idle time in prison that "turns imagination into fact." The conclusion is a promise: "I'm gonna pay 'em

all back.' Kelly's love for Shakespeare, the bard's mix of com-

edy and drama, is also evident in the composition. One of Kelly's first clues that he had tapped into something was a call from his real-life brother. He'd been driving and heard the song for the first time over the radio, and had to pull to the side of the road in tears.

It's a holiday song without mistletoe or holly. Structurally, it doesn't have a catchy chorus, or any chorus at all. Yet as years went by, his fans would request the song in concert all year, not just the holidays. Some of them began marking Dec. 21 by leaving a can of gravy on their front porches.

"I can't predict what songs will become popular or speak to my audience," Kelly said this fall in an interview with The Associated Press, and "Gravy" is

a prime example.

The evocation of family is the song's most important ingredient. Kelly's own large family gathers each Christmas Eve to sing carols. Bella O'Grady, a 27-year-old woman who moved to New York and attended a Kelly concert in New York this fall for

a taste of home, said "How to Make Gravy" always evokes warm feelings of holiday celebrations.

Sometimes very warm. While many of the song's emotions are universal, a reference in the lyrics to expected heat on Christmas Day - "I hear it's going to be 100 degrees" - places the setting clearly in Australia. Down under, the holiday is at the beginning of


summer.

"Australians speak about what it's like to have someone who's a loved one - they sing the great Paul Kelly song - in jail over Christmas," Albanese said, according to The Nightly. "Who's going to make the gravy? Well, these families had their loved ones in jail for 20 Christmases, and that was enough."

Using the characters in Kelly's song and building a story around it, filmmaker Nick Waterman made a movie of "How to Make Gravy" this year that is airing on the Australian streaming service Binge. It is being shown in some movie theaters free on "Gravy Day" weekend.

So what's in that gravy recipe, anyway? "Just add flour, salt, a little red wine and don't forget a dollop of tomato sauce for sweetness and that extra tang. It's all in the song.







Keir Starmer, I phone Keir Starmer. If I want to phone Trump, he's not taking my call," Williams says with a laugh. "Maybe he would, I don't know.

"Maybe this film moves the needle for me," Williams, 50, adds. "Or if it doesn't, I'll do something else.'

What both a conversation with Williams and "Better Man" have in common is a frankness about the experience of fame. More than it's a litany of chart-topping successes, "Better Man" is a chronicle of fame-induced trauma, complete with drug addiction and mental breakdown.

Williams, now, though, is a reformed bad boy - a family man with four kids with all kinds of plans, like building hotels and buying sports teams. "At the moment," he says, "I

have the wide-optimism of a new artist.

AP: Did your identification with monkeys predate "Better Man"?

Williams: Well, let me know, in the biography of your life, what animal would play you?

AP. I don't know. A chipmunk? Williams: I asked my friend this morning, Joey McIntyre, from New Kids on the Block, and he said, "an owl." And I agreed with him. An owl would be good for him. Did this predate? I guess so, subconsciously. My MO has been cheeky. What's more cheeky than a cheeky monkey? I've been a cheeky monkey all my life. There's no more cheekier monkey than the coke-snorting, sex-addict monkey that we find in the movie.

AP: I've never seen a monkey do so much coke.

Williams: Yeah, we've seen a bear do a lot of coke but never a monkey.

AP: Do you think it's easier for audiences to empathize with a monkey than for you?

Williams: We care for animals more than we care for humans, most of us. I guess there is a removal, as well. It's very much a human story but if you're watching it and someone's playing Robbie Williams, you're thinking: Does he look like him? Does he act like him? Does he talk like him?

AP: As someone who's been open about difficulties in life, you're not new to the idea that people don't have a lot of sympathy for wealthy pop stars. You were probably suffering very human things at a time when people didn't see vou as human.

Williams: I think they have sympathy once you come through

I (expletive) love it. I wouldn't trade it for the world. I'm 50 and I'm incredibly grateful for fame. It facilitates everything that I need and want to do with my life. I was just too young to receive it, and I wasn't surrounded by good people. And I wasn't good people. But now I can't speak highly enough of it. (Laughs)

AP: Part of your appeal has always been your candor. In your experience, though, does show business work against remaining authentic?

Williams: It depends who you are. Most people I meet in the industry, they're nice folk. But a lot of the people that I meet also are narcissists and they understand on some level that it's best to cover up their true nature. So they do. Now there's cancellation, so you've got a lot of people terrified of saying the wrong thing.

The interesting that I've carved out for me, by mistake, is that the only villain in my story when I talk is me. None of my opinions are political. None of my opinions are cancellable. The only person that can cancel me is me.

AP: So how did you turn your life around? You've often credited your wife

Williams: Ayda was credited with saving my life before she saved my life. I was like, "You (expletive)." I was like: I've done a lot of work on myself here. Don't give her all the credit. But now I can give her way more credit than I was giving her because I've realize how much she's done.

Without that grounding, my life would be a lot different. I probably wouldn't be here. Because I have somebody in my life that's worth me being the best version of myself 24 hours out of the day, I'm better. And because there's four young souls that need looking after, my purpose is a lot different. I suppose my purpose at one time, due to finding hedonism incredibly intoxicating, was to be the most (expletive) person in the room. But now I want to be the most well person in the room. I intend to be the wellest person in the mother-(expletive) room. (Laughs)

AP: When you go on a worldwide tour next year, do you do things differently to help you stay sane'

Williams: Yeah and no. The no bit is: It's OK. I've come to realize, I didn't die. There's a bit more wisdom now. The lunatic that was in the car is still in the car, but he doesn't drive anymore.

'Lion King' prequel brings fresh storytelling

Jenkins brings fresh energy to 'Mufasa'

LOS ANGELES, Dec 21, (AP): "Mufasa: The Lion King" has one very important thing going for it: an original story.

That may seem like faint praise or at least a very, very low bar in the grand scheme of things. But in a landscape where Disney continues to remake its animated catalogue in slightly different, and usually less interesting, forms whether "live action" or "photorealistic" that usually only serves to remind how good the 2D animation was, originality is not to be undervalued.

And this story isn't simply checking off fan service boxes and overexplaining origins that never needed them: It's actually good. A prequel to "The Lion King," opened in theaters Thursday, it's a tale of found family, betrayal and destiny, one that begins to explain the estrangement between brothers Scar and Mufasa that we all know will end in murder, how Mufasa (Aaron Pierre) ends up as king of the pride lands and, perhaps most importantly, why only one has an English accent.

In this telling, Scar was once Taka (Kelvin Harrison Jr.), destined to be king of his pride, and Mufasa was a lost cub, separated from his parents in a dramatic flood. Taka saves Mufasa and brings him into his family. His mother (Thandiwe Newton) embraces the newcomer; his father (Lennie James) rejects him as nothing but a stray. Not that it matters much to the cubs; both are thrilled to have a brother. They play

and protect one another and grow up together. But fissures start to appear in this foundation as Mufasa emerges as the exceptional one and Taka as the coward. And then a lioness enters the picture in Sarabi (Tiffany Boone). We've all seen enough movies to know what happens with that.

The screenplay comes from veteran screenwriter Jeff Nathanson, whose credits include the 2019 "Lion King," this year's lovely "Young Woman and the Sea" and "Catch Me If You Can."

Mandate

He clearly took a corporate mandate (give us more "Lion King") and made the absolute least cynical version of that. There are still questionable corporatefeeling choices, like straining to tie it to a current and future "Lion King" by having Rafiki (John Kani) tell the story to Simba (Donald Glover) and Nala's (Beyoncé) daughter Kiara (Blue Ivy Carter), Pumbaa (Seth Rogen) and Timon (Billy Eichner). These comedic breaks, and Lin-Manuel Miranda's songs peppered throughout, aren't additive. They really only serve to break up the momentum of the compelling main story.

But the biggest issue remains the form itself. The photo-realistic computer-generated animals may have technically improved since the 2019 "Lion King," but they still aren't movie stars like their 2D animation counterparts. Impressive though it may be intellectually, the reality of watching these animals for two hours is a somewhat numbing and dull experience despite the best efforts of director Barry Jenkins. The Oscar-winning filmmaker of "Moonlight" did an admirable job adding visual interest and color into the landscapes, bringing it closer to the vibrancy of animation than ever before, and making it as cinematic as possible. The original story also helps here in that he was never going to have to recreate iconic sequences in a less stimulating form. There are just inherent limitations that filmmakers have not yet figured out, including how odd it looks for these animals? mouths to be moving and speaking English words. It's strangest when they're singing, mouths agape to hold the long notes in a way that no lion's mouth should ever appear.

If this is one future for filmmaking there's still a lot of room for improvement and experimentation. That doesn't mean it shouldn't be embraced while the kinks are worked out. But it also doesn't mean the moviegoing public has to get excited about every rehash. "Mufasa: The Lion King" is better than the ones that came before it, but that doesn't mean it's great.

"Mufasa: The Lion King," a Walt Disney Studios release in theaters Thursday, is rated PG by the Motion Picture Association for "peril, action/violence and some thematic elements." Running time: 118 minutes. Two and a half stars out of four.

LONDON: Thousands of tourists, pagans, druids and people simply yearning for the promise of spring marked the dawn of the shortest day of the year at the ancient Stonehenge monument on Saturday.

Revelers cheered and beat drums as the sun rose at 8:09 a.m. (0809 GMT) over the giant standing stones on the winter solstice - the shortest day and the longest night in the Northern Hemisphere. No one could see the sun through the low winter cloud, but that did not deter a flurry of drumming, chanting and singing as dawn broke.

There will be less than eight hours of daylight in England on Saturday - but after that, the days get longer until the summer solstice in June.

The solstices are the only occasions when visitors can go right up to the stones at Stonehenge, and thousands are willing to rise before dawn to soak up the atmosphere.

The stone circle, whose giant pillars each took ,000 people to move, was erected starting about years ago by a sun-worshiping Neolithic cul-5.000 ture. Its full purpose is still debated: Was it a temple, a solar calculator, a cemetery, or some combination of all three?

Early Americas history

Humans and giant sloths 'coexisted' for millennia

SAO PAULO, Dec 21, (AP): Sloths weren't always slow-moving, furry tree-dwellers. Their prehistoric ancestors were huge - up to 4 tons (3.6 metric tons) - and when startled, they brandished immense claws.

For a long time, scientists believed the first humans to arrive in the Americas soon killed off these giant ground sloths through hunting, along with many other massive animals like mastodons, saber-toothed cats and dire wolves that once roamed North and South America.

But new research from several sites is starting to suggest that people came to the Americas earlier - perhaps far earlier - than once thought. These findings hint at a remarkably different life for these early Americans, one in which they may have spent millennia sharing prehistoric savannas and wetlands with enormous beasts.

"There was this idea that humans arrived and killed everything off very quickly - what's called 'Pleistocene overkill," said Daniel Odess, an archaeologist at White Sands National Park in New Mexico. But new discoveries suggest that "humans were existing alongside these animals for at least 10,000 years, without making them go extinct."

Some of the most tantalizing clues come from an archaeological site in central Brazil, called Santa Elina, where bones of giant ground sloths show signs of being manipulated by humans. Sloths like these once lived from Alaska to Argentina, and some species had bony structures on their backs, called osteoderms - a bit like the plates of modern armadillos - that may have been used to make decorations.

Fossil

In a lab at the University of Sao Paulo, researcher Mírian Pacheco holds in her palm a round, penny-sized sloth fossil. She notes that its surface is surprisingly smooth, the edges appear to have been deliberately polished, and there's a tiny hole near one edge.

"We believe it was intentionally altered and used by ancient people as

"There's still a big debate," Pacheco said.

Scientists know that the first humans emerged in Africa, then moved into Europe and Asia-Pacific, before finally making their way to the last continental frontier, the Americas. But questions remain about the final chapter of the human origins story.

Pacheco was taught in high school the theory that most archaeologists held throughout the 20th century. "What I learned in school was that Clovis was first," she said.

Clovis is a site in New Mexico, where archaeologists in the 1920s and 1930s found distinctive projectile points and other artifacts dated to between 11,000 and 13,000 years ago.

Ice Age

This date happens to coincide with the end of the last Ice Age, a time when an ice-free corridor likely emerged in North America - giving rise to an idea about how early humans moved into the continent after crossing the Bering land bridge from Asia.

And because the fossil record shows the widespread decline of American megafauna starting around the same time - with North America losing 70% of its large mammals, and South America losing more than 80% - many researchers surmised that humans' arrival led to mass extinctions.

"It was a nice story for a while, when all the timing lined up," said paleoanthropologist Briana Pobiner at the Smithsonian Institution's Human Origins Program. "But it doesn't really work so well anymore.'

In the past 30 years, new research methods - including ancient DNA analysis and new laboratory techniques coupled with the examination of additional archaeological sites and inclusion of more diverse scholars across the Americas, have upended the old narrative and raised new questions, especially about timing.

"Anything older than about 15,000 years still draws intense scrutiny," said Richard Fariña, a paleontologist at the

Kuwait performs 1st remote robotic prostate surgery

KUWAIT CITY, Dec 21: Sabah Al-Ahmad Kidney and Urology Center has successfully performed the first radical prostatectomy in the Middle East using the Medbot Toumai remote robot. The groundbreaking procedure was conducted on a Kuwaiti patient diagnosed with cancer, positioning Kuwait as one of the first countries globally to execute such complex and advanced surgeries.

FDA order

'Pull fake Lilly obesity drug'

WASHINGTON, Dec 21, (AP): Specialty pharmacies and online companies that have been selling off-brand copies of two block-buster drugs for obesity and dia-betes will need to phase out their versions next year under a federal decision issued Thursday.

The Food and Drug Administration said that a nationwide shortage of Eli Lilly's Zepbound and Mounjaro has been resolved, eliminating the need for copycat versions of the drugs that have become wildly popular with Americans trying to lose weight.

The decision is a win for Lilly which had been pressing the FDA to take the step for months - and is expected to impact how patients access the drugs, including how much they pay.

Zepbound is FDA-approved to treat obesity and Mounjaro is approved for diabetes. They use the same active ingredient, tirzepatide.

The FDA said Thursday that "Lilly's supply is currently meeting or exceeding demand," after two years of shortages.

Both drugs are part of the GLP-1 class that has shown unprecedented results for helping people shed weight by decreasing appetite and boosting feelings of fullness. Wegovy and Ozempic - competing drugs from Novo Nordisk - remain on the FDA's shortage list.

With demand for GLP-1 drugs booming, compounding pharmacies and telehealth companies like Hims and Ro have jumped into the market, selling cheaper versions online. People can usually get a month's supply for several hundred dollars.

New food labels aim to curb chronic diseases

US updates 'healthy' foods definition

NEW YORK, Dec 21, (AP): Packaged foods in the US will have to follow new rules in order to call themselves "healthy," according to changes finalized by the Food and Drug Administration.

It's an update of the agency's definition originally devised 30 years ago. The move is aimed at helping Americans navigate food labels at the grocery store and make choices that are aligned with federal dietary guidelines - in hopes of reducing rates of diet-related chronic disease, the FDA said.

Under the rule, products that claim to be "healthy" must contain a cer-tain amount of food from one or more food groups such as fruit, vegetables, grains, dairy and protein. And for the first time, the rule sets certain limits for added sugars. Foods must also limit sodium and saturated fat at levels that depend on the type of product, the FDA said.

The change banishes foods such as sugary cereals, highly sweetened yo-gurts, white bread and some granola bars from bearing a "healthy" label, while allowing foods such as avocados, olive oil, salmon, eggs and some trail mix to use it. Even water can now be labeled as healthy, the agency said.

"It's critical for the future of the country that food be a vehicle for well-ness," FDA Commissioner Robert Califf said in a statement. "Improving

In Sao Paulo and at the Federal University of Sao Carlos, Pacheco studies the chemical changes that occur when a bone becomes a fossil. This allows her team to analyze when the sloth osteoderms were likely modified.

"We found that the osteoderms were carved before the fossilization process" in "fresh bones" - meaning anywhere from a few days to a few years after the sloths died, but not thousands of years later.

Her team also tested and ruled out several natural processes, like erosion and animal gnawing. The research was published last year in the journal Proceedings of the Royal Society B.

Thursday's decision gives businesses between 60 and 90 days, depending on their size, to phase out their products.

The FDA permits compounded versions of brand name drugs when they are in shortage, and the shift back to Lilly's medications could improve safety for consumers. The FDA warned patients last year about problems with the ingredients and formulations of some GLP-1 drugs sold online. The agency has limited oversight of compounding pharmacies, which are primarily overseen by state authorities.

Rwandan government on Friday declared the outbreak in Rwanda of the Ebola-like Marburg fever over after no new cases were registered in recent weeks.

The country first declared the outbreak on Sept. 27 and reported a total of 15 deaths and 66 cases, with the majority of those affected healthcare workers who handled the first patients.

Without treatment, Marburg can be fatal in up to 88% of people who fall ill with the disease. Symptoms include fever, muscle pains, diarrhea, vomiting and, in some cases, death through extreme blood loss.

There is no authorized vaccine or treatment for Marburg, though Rwanda received hundreds of doses of a vaccine under trial in October.

Rwanda discharged the last Marburg patient on Nov. 8 and had reported no new confirmed cases since Oct. 30.

However, WHO officials and Rwanda's Health Minister Dr. Sabin Nzanzimana on Friday said risks remain and that people should stay vigilant.

"We believe it's not completely over because we still face risks, especially from bats. We are continuing to build new strategies, form new health teams, and deploy advanced technologies to track their movements, understand their behavior, and monitor who is interacting with them," the minister announced during a press conference in the capital, Kigali.

Cavs roll over Bucks, improve to 15-1 at home

Oklahoma City remains red-hot by topping Miami

CLEVELAND, Dec 21, (AP): Donovan Mitchell scored 27 points, Darius Garland added 16 and the Cleveland Cavaliers moved to 15-1 at home with a 124-101 win on Friday night over the Milwaukee Bucks, who played for the first time since winning the NBA Cup.

Cleveland is 3-0 this season against Milwaukee, which was without All-Star guard Damian Lillard because of a strained calf.

Evan Mobley scored 15 and Cleveland made 20 3-pointers while pushing its league-best record to 24-4.

Giannis Antetokounmpo had 33 points and 14 rebounds for the Bucks, who may need a couple more days to shake off their collective hangover after winning the Cup on Tuesday in Las Vegas.

With Lillard sidelined, the Bucks were missing their second-best player and 25.7 points per game. Milwaukee's starting guards - Andre Jackson Jr. and AJ Green - shot a combined 0 of 9.

Doc Rivers doesn't believe Lillard's injury is "severe" and the team is being cautious. ... Rivers said it was "weird" winning a tournament and resuming play. The turnaround didn't give Mil-

Lu Dort scored 14 points and Isaiah Hartenstein had 13 points and 18 rebounds for the Thunder, who improved to 22-5 - the second-best record in the NBA and tops in the Western Conference.

Oklahoma City's winning streak is alive because the NBA Cup final a loss Tuesday night to Milwaukee in Las Vegas - doesn't count as a regular-season game.

Tyler Herro had 28 points and 12 rebounds for Miami, which got 17 points and 10 rebounds from Bam Adebayo.

The Heat lost Jimmy Butler to illness in the first quarter and briefly lost Adebayo in the third quarter when he got elbowed over an eye by teammate Jaime Jaquez Jr. Adebayo needed seven stitches but returned.

Embiid has been ravaged by injuries this season and has only played in seven games, mostly due to knee soreness.

Players say they are at breaking point

Top players have had enough, FIFA new super-sized tournament sparks a revolt

MANCHESTER, England, Dec 21, (AP): One of the most striking moments of soccer in 2024 was when Rodri hobbled onto a stage in Paris on crutches to receive the prestigious Ballon d'Or for best male player of the year.

The Manchester City and Spain midfielder had been one of the most outspoken critics against the increasingly congested soccer calendar, warning that the lack of downtime was detrimental to players' perjust a month before the Oct. 28 award ceremony, he tore his ACL during a seemingly routine run in a Premier League game against Arsenal. Though such injuries have occurred throughout the history of the sport and aren't necessarily linked to overplaying, Rodri's season-ending injury became a visual representation of the physical toll of modern soccer at a time when the busy match schedule is facing legal challenges and the possibility of strike action. Top footballers are now routinely playing more than 60 games per season for club and country, while the game is getting faster and more intense. Injuries are on the rise. Already pushed to their limits, some players say FIFA's newly expanded Club World Cup, to be held in the United States next year, is the last straw. Players say they are "at breaking point, that they are at the limit, that it's actually too much," Alexander Bielefeld, from global players' union FIFPRO, told The Associated Press. The new Club World Cup is a supersized version of what used to be a short tournament with only seven teams. The new edition includes 32 teams from around the world and will be held every four years, starting next summer in the United States from June 14 to July 13. As its name suggests, it's envisioned to be club version of the World Cup for national teams. That means top players will have a monthlong tournament on top of their domestic league season three

Odermatt finally wins in Gardena as he dominates downhill

SELVA DI VAL GARDENA, Italy, Dec 21, (AP): Marco Odermatt finally conquered the Saslong.

The three-time overall World Cup champion dominated on Saturday to win a downhill in Val Gardena, beating Swiss teammate Franjo von Allmen by 0.45 seconds.

It was Odermatt's first victory at the resort in the Italian Dolomites. The 27-year-old had had four podium finishes there - including in Saturday's super-G - but had never been better than second.

It had also been a less than stellar start to the season for Odermatt - by his lofty standards - and the Swiss standout yelled out in joy several times after crossing the line, before taking off his skis and raising them up and letting out another long yell.

George Eastham dies at 88: Former England midfielder George Eastham, a member of the country's 1966 World Cup winning squad who was better known for his social activism, has died. He was 88.

Soccer club Stoke City announced Eastham's death late Friday, saying it was "immensely saddened" to lose a "club legend." It did not specify a cause of death.

Eastham made 19 appearances for England, following the path set by his father, George Eastham senior, though the last of those games was before the 1966 World Cup. He did not feature at the tournament itself, where he was the only Arsenal player in the ultimately successful England squad.

Eastham had to wait for a World Cup winner's medal until 2007, when FIFA ruled that medals should be awarded retrospectively to non-playing squad members of previous finals. (AP)

Palmeiras signs Torres: Palmeiras has completed the signing of Uruguay international winger Facundo Torres from Orlando City, the Brazilian Serie A side said on Friday

The 24-year-old ended weeks of speculation by agreeing to personal terms of a deal that ties him to the Sao Paulo-based club until 2029.

Another super-G is scheduled for St. Moritz on Sunday.

Savelev had reached a career-high world doubles ranking of 1,486 in August 2022.

The ITIA said that it believed that Savelev had not intentionally taken the banned substance, saying that 'Savelev admitted to ingesting meldonium tablets, confusing family medication for supplements of a similar appearance.

The doping watchdog said that Savelev agreed to accept the suspension since he did "not take any steps to mitigate" the rules violation. (AP)

Williams traded to Reign: The Seattle Reign have acquired Olympic gold medalist Lynn Williams in a trade with Gotham FC.

The Reign also received goalkeeper Cassie Miller in the trade announced Friday. Gotham received midfielder Jaelin Howell, an international roster spot and \$70,000 in allocation money.

Williams, the National Women's Soccer League's alltime leading scorer with 80 goals, joined the league in 2015 as the sixth overall draft pick by the now-defunct Western New York Flash.

Over the course of her NWSL career, Williams has won four league championships and three NWSL Shields. She was the league's Most Valuable Player and the Golden Boot winner for most goals in 2016.

Williams has appeared in 75 games for the U.S., scoring 25 goals and 13 assists. She earned a bronze medal with the team at the Tokyo Olympics, and a gold in the Paris Games this summer. (AP)

Al-Qadsiya challenges nullification

KUWAIT CITY, Dec 21: Al-Qadsiya Club has announced its intention to escalate its grievance to the International Volleyball Federation following the Kuwaiti Vollevball Federation's decision to nullify the results of the club's first team in the Federation Championship. The tournament, which concluded last Thursday, saw Kazma crowned champions after a 3-0 victory over Kuwait SC in the final. This decision barred Al-Qadsiya from participating in the final, despite qualifying for it

alongside Kuwait Club.

As a result, the federation nullified all matches in which Beyk participated, awarding a 0-3 forfeit loss to Al-Qadsiya and imposing a fine of 400 Kuwaiti dinars per match.

In its protest letter, Al-Qadsiya Club emphasized the legitimacy of Beyk's registration, stating that the procedures were completed and approved by the federation before the registration deadline on November 17. The club further noted that the player's registration card had been issued, signifying compliance with all requirements.

The club also highlighted its proactive communication with the federation following Kazma's protest. Al-Qadsiya submitted the player s international transfer certificate for verification a second time to reaffirm the accuracy of Beyk's registration data. Al-Qadsiya Club expressed its disappointment with the decision, asserting that it undermines the integrity of the championship. The club reiterated its commitment to defending its legal position and ensuring fair play in the competition. This dispute highlights ongoing challenges in player registration processes and underscores the need for clear and consistent regulations to uphold the credibility of sports tournaments.

Bahrain's head coach, Croatian Dragan Talajic, expressed readiness to

Al-Qadsiya submitted a formal protest to the local volleyball federation, demanding the reversal of what it called an unjust decision and the restoration of its right to defend its position. The controversy stems from the federation's claim of an administrative error in registering Al-Qadsiya's Iranian professional player, Mohammad Reza Bevk. According to the federation, Beyk was officially registered a day after the professional registration window closed, constituting a breach of regulations.

MUNICH, Dec 21, (AP): Bayern Munich crushed Leipzig 5-1 and broke a long-standing Bundesliga record for quickfire goals.

Two teams had never scored in the opening two minutes of a Bundesliga match until Jamal Musiala gave Bayern the lead after 28 seconds and Benjamin Šeško equalized barely 60 seconds later.

The pace slowed after that frenetic start but not for long. Konrad Laimer put Bayern ahead against his old club in the 25th. Michael Olise found space on the right side and Laimer gave Péter Gulácsi no chance with a crisp volley.

Nine minutes later, Joshua Kimmich lashed home from almost 30 meters to make it 3-1.

Leroy Sané added the fourth with 15 minutes remaining and Alphonso Davies got his first league goal of the season to complete the rout three minutes later.

Harry Kane returned and looked rusty after missing two games with a hamstring injury but played 87 minutes of a match that helped Bayern get back on track after a rocky run.

After winning eight games in a row from late October to late November, the Bavarian giant lost two and drew one of its next five, including a 2-1 defeat to Mainz last week, its first loss in the Bundesliga.

The Dutch striker finished superbly after a Youssouf Fofana pass opened the Verona defense early in the second half.

The win was Milan's eighth consecutive league win against Verona and got it back to winning ways after losing to Atalanta and drawing with Genova.

It should ease some pressure on under-fire coach Paulo Fonseca. His side was up to seventh place in Serie A.

Verona sat a point above the relegation zone.

Girona beat Valladolid 3-0 and snapped an unhappy run of six games without a win in La Liga.

The result lifted Girona two places to eighth while Valladolid stayed second from bottom with just three wins in 18 games.

Valladolid has conceded more goals than any other team but it could do nothing about the opener after 31 minutes. David López's shot from outside the box took a deflection and wrongfooted goalkeeper Karl Hein.



City stunning slump continues

LONDON, Dec 21, (AP): Manchester City's stunning slump continued Saturday with a 2-1 loss to Aston Villa in the Premier League.

Goals from Jhon Duran and Morgan Rogers at Villa Park consigned the four-time defending champion to a ninth defeat in 12 games. Pep Guardiola's team has won just once during that run.

Phil Foden pulled a goal back for City in stoppage time, but it wasn't enough to spark a late comeback.

City dropped to sixth in the standings - nine points below leader Liverpool, having played two games more.

Villa climbed to fifth.

City's remarkable fall shows little sign of stopping, with Guardiola admitting last week that he had not been good enough to turn his team's form around.

Defeat meant his once dominant team is without a win in any of its last eight away games in all competitions. While its title defense is unravelling, a place in the top four and Champions League qualification could also be in jeopardy.

A sixth league defeat is City's worst record since the 2020-21 season.

Villa dominated the game with Duran scoring his sixth goal in as many starts in the 16th minute from Rogers' assist.

Villa had a goal disallowed for offside in the second half and Rogers hit the post before doubling the home side's lead in the 65th.

Foden gave City a slim hope of salvaging something with his goal in the third minute of added time.

Manchester City's troubled season was dealt another blow with confirmation that defender Ruben Dias will be out for up to four weeks because of a muscle injury.

Manager Pep Guardiola has cited injuries to key players such as Rodri as a factor in his team's troubles and the loss of Dias compounds his problems.

Guardiola said Dias' injury occurred during Sunday's 2-1 loss to Manchester United.

"After 75 minutes against United he felt something. He's strong and wanted to stay on the pitch, but now he's injured," Guardiola told a news conference.

Mason Mount faces "several weeks" out of action because of a latest injury, Manchester United head coach Ruben Amorim said.

The midfielder was substituted after 14 minutes of the 2-1 win over Manchester City on Sunday due to a muscle problem and was consoled by teammates as he left the field. Allen claims victory at Riyadh Season Snooker Championship

RIYADH, Dec 21, (Xinhua): The 2024 Riyadh Season Snooker Championship concluded on Friday at the Boulevard City, Riyadh. Northern Ireland's Mark Allen secured the title with a commanding 5-1 victory over Belgium's Luca Brecel in the final, earning winnings of 250,000 pounds.

This year's championship brought together the world's top 10 snooker players, including current world No. 1 Judd Trump, seven-time world champion Ronnie O'Sullivan, China's top player Ding Junhui and rising star Zhang Anda.

Over three days of intense competition, Allen demonstrated remarkable form and consistency, advancing through each stage and ultimately claiming the prestigious trophy.

The tournament, which commenced on December 18, adopted a best-of-seven format for earlier rounds and a best-of-nine format for the final. Several high-stakes matches captured attention.

In the semifinals, Brecel defeated Mark Williams 4-2, while Allen eliminated defending champion O'Sullivan by the same scoreline. In the final, Allen main-

tained his dominance, dropping only one frame against Brecel to clinch the victory, marking another significant milestone in his career.

Chinese players also delivered commendable performances. Ding Junhui triumphed 4-0 over local player Abdulraouf Saigh in the first round but was defeated 4-0 by O'Sullivan in the quarterfinals. Meanwhile, Zhang Anda overcame Ahmed Aseeri 4-0 in the opening round but fell to Brecel in the second round.

In an exclusive interview with Xinhua, Ding expressed optimism about the future of young Chinese snooker players, emphasizing their dedication to rigorous training and their growing presence on the international stage.

He also praised Saudi Arabia for its efforts in introducing diverse sports and creating an excellent platform for high-level competitions, which he said will significantly benefit the development of snooker in the region.
